## SF Waterfront Building Levelled

San Francisco — (U.P.) — A spectacular fire destroyed an abandoned Pacific Gas and Electric company building on the San Francisco waterfront early today.

The blaze, which sent a shower of sparks high into the air, threatened a Navy ship, a gas storage area and the Columbia Machinery company before it was brought under control.

The Navy vessel, which was berthed alongside the fire area, helped fight the fire until it was under control. The ship then cast off and moved out of the bay. There was no immediate report of injuries.

The fire occurred in the Potrero Point district of San Francisco's industrial section.
