FIFTY YEARS OF DAMPNESS BUNK

At the turn of the century Dr. Osler opined, in the "doctor's bible," that chronic rheumatism was most common among the poor, particularly wash-

men - women - day - laborers and those whose occupation exposes them to cold and damp.

Then, apparently to regretting that it was an affliction of the poor, Osler said "Climatic treatment is very advantageous. Many cases are greatly helped by prolonged residence in Europe, Southern California . . . in this way avoid the cold, damp weather."

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I'm not a twentieth century Dr. Osler, but let me tell you poor folks, washer-women, day-laborers, snow shovellers, cold storage men, butchers, occupants of basement apartments or build-

ings with concrete floors, that it may be pleasant wintering in Egypt, the south of France or LaJolla, but it won't do your rheumatism any good.

Fifty years later medical authorities seem unimpressed by change of climate. Some of 'em seem reluctant to relinquish the old bunk entirely perhaps because they have good friends in the health resort business.

One recognized authority on arthritis and other joint disabilities regards "atrophic" (rheu-

matoid) arthritis as "one of the most common and most serious forms of rheumatic disease" (it would never do to say rheumatiz) and shows how far we have progressed since Osler's time by furnishing Osler's view with horsefeathers:

"It is not difficult to perceive the adverse effect of a cold damp climate . . . to which the average individual can adjust himself . . . may lead to lowering of the general resistance . . . higher incidence of atrophic arthritis among those living under poor housing conditions and among those who through occupation are continually exposed to cold and wet."

You see, children, we still have with us the poor, low resistance and occupations that ex-

pose the poor souls to cold and dampness.

Dr. Osler was not unfamiliar with the \$10 word "arthritis," but when he presented his version of rheumatism he didn't see fit to impress the customers with his knowledge.

As a matter of fact "arthritis" is a misnomer for joint disability of over a year's standing, with few exceptions. It means inflammation, and in most instances of chronic rheumatism there is no sign of inflammation present. The trouble is joint degeneration, due, I believe to nutritional deficiency through the years from childhood to breakfast, and for further information about it, it can do you no harm to send a stamped, self-addressed envelope and ask for
