Washington — (U.P.) — The Senate Democratic leadership is understood to be still searching for a formula that would unite nearly all Democratic senators behind an income tax cut. None has yet been found.

CONGRESSMEN OPEN ECHO PARK DISPUTE

Washington — (U.P.) — Rep. John F. Baldwin Jr., (R-Calif.) criticized the proposed Echo Park dam in the upper Colorado river project Saturday and said it would flood and destroy the natural beauty of the Yampa River Gorge.

Sen. Eugene D. Millikin (R-Colo.) replied to Baldwin, saying "All you are interested in is preserving a harsh and dry bottom of a canyon. We've got some beautiful canyons in Colorado — we're not short of canyons."

Millikin said what the west needs is some lakes to reflect its mountains, like Switzerland's.

Baldwin argued that the canyon should be kept as a wilderness, "a rare, unique scenic area in its present form."

Baldwin was one of a string of other California witnesses who in the past two days have objected to the upper Colorado project on grounds it would impair their rights to water and to power generated at Hoover dam.

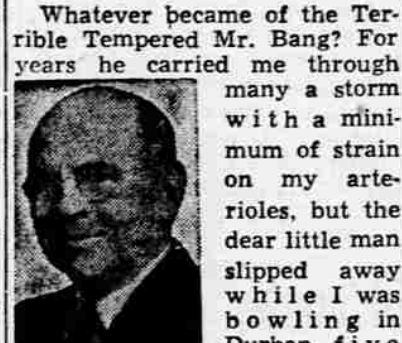

OPEN SEASON FOR TONSILS

Whatever became of the Terrible Tempered Mr. Bang? For years he carried me through many a storm with a minimum of strain on my arteries, but the dear little man slipped away while I was bowling in Durban five years ago and now, when I have a spell I have to roll it out alone—somersaults, I mean, or, as Young Bill's physical instructor calls 'em, forward rolls. Whatever you call 'em, I assure you they are fine for the arterioles if you will roll a few whenever you are greatly vexed, annoyed, irritated, incensed, burned up or just plain mad. No, no, knucklehead, I'm not jesting. I've been doing my morning rolls ever since Tony was a pup—one of the few medicines I take myself. If you want to know more about it send me a stamped envelope bearing your address and ask for the pamphlet *The Somersaultauqua*.

Recently I quoted from Osler's *Practice* what the famous 18th century anatomist and surgeon, John Hunter, used to say (his arterioles were not very good): "My life is in the hands of any rascal who chooses to annoy and tease me." Poor fellow. Some rascal polished him off at the age of 65. Awfully I'm a nut, as any racketeer will tell you, but I believe any man with coronary arterioles like Hunter's may stay with us four or five more years if he rolls somersaults every day.

What makes me long for the chuckles I used to get from the lovable Mr. Bang is the recurrence of the open season for tonsils—the month of March.

I could take it fairly well even without Mr. Bang's help by constantly reassuring myself that, after all, most of the children subjected to the atrocity in the open season will survive. But this doesn't work when the first of the annual series of newspaper clippings arrives — photographs of whole families of children who have been or are about to be deprived of their tonsils.

The ever-ready operators who perpetrate the atrocity "for no particular reason" (as one recognized authority says—I named him here recently) get a way with it in most instances by convincing the parents the child's tonsils are enlarged and by calling enlarged tonsils "those bad tonsils." Sometimes they obtain parental consent by deceit: Without committing themselves, inextricably they manage to suggest that the child will continue to have frequent "colds" until those bad tonsils are removed.

The truth is—and no reputable physician will attempt to deny it—that the tonsils of children four to seven years of age are normally enlarged. And in late winter and early spring the tonsils of most children are enlarged. If school children are examined at this time of year a majority of them will have large tonsils — so large that some school physicians advise parents to take the children to the family physician. But late in the summer and in the early fall these children's tonsils will have shrunk to what even the ever-ready operator must admit is normal size. And without risk to life.

Later in the season come reports of tragic occurrences in the course of or following the atrocious operation. Then I have

the alternative of going mad or hurrying over to the bowling green.

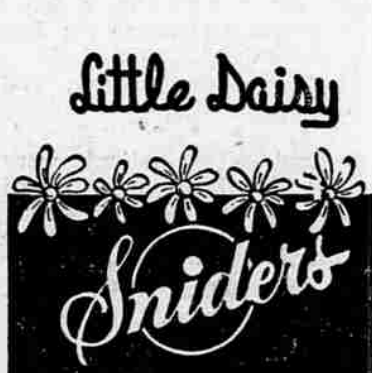

Faure Names Palewski To Atomic Energy Job

Paris—(U.P.) —Premier Edgar Faure has given Gaston Palewski, ski sweeping powers over defense planning and nuclear research in what may be a first step toward French production of atomic and hydrogen bombs.

Palewski, a conservative supporter of Gen. Charles De Gaulle and an outspoken foe of West German rearmament, will be responsible for coordinating all defense plans and activities, including the work of France's atomic energy commission.

Observers here viewed the inclusion of atomic energy among

Palewski's responsibilities as a sign Faure intends to yield to the mounting press campaign for a nuclear weapons program to make France's voice heard among her allies.
