Missionary Couple Nazarene Speakers

The Rev. and Mrs. Spurgeon L. Hendrix, missionaries from Argentina, will speak Sunday at 2:30 p.m. in a Southern Oregon missionary convention for the Church of the Nazarene at the Medford Church, Holly and First sts.

The Rev. Hendrix recently arrived in this country for his second furlough. During the period of his stay in the United States, he will teach at the Nazarene Theological seminary in Kansas City, Mo., and do deputation work under the direction of the department of foreign missions of the church.

Leaving for the field in 1941, the Rev. Mr. Hendrix, after language study, assumed pastoral and evangelistic work in Buenos Aires. Recently he has also served as director of the Nazarene Bible school in the same city.

He is a graduate of Bethany-Peniel college at Bethany, Okla., where he received his training in theology.

Mrs. Hendrix has taught in the public schools in Oklahoma and has done evangelistic work. The missionaries will be accompanied by the district president of the Oregon-Pacific Nazarene Foreign Mission society, Mrs. H. E. Priddy, of Portland, and the Rev. and Mrs. W. D. McGraw Jr., also of Portland. The Rev. McGraw is the Oregon-Pacific District Superintendent for the Church of the Nazarene.

Work has been started on a new church building for the Philadelphia church, a denomination new to Medford. The edifice is being built on property in the Rogue Valley heights district one block off the old Crater Lake highway on Grandview ave.

The Philadelphia church is a part of a full Gospel fellowship consisting of churches throughout this country, Canada and other countries.

Adventist Youth Close Observances

Young people of the Medford area of the Seventh Day Adventist church, along with some 300,000 other Adventist youth around the world, are observing an annual "Week of Prayer."

Saturday marks the close of the week-long series of nightly meetings centered around the theme "In Quest of the Best." The Sabbath church service will be devoted exclusively to the young people. At that time a baptismal class will be formed for those who want to prepare for church membership by additional Bible study.

In reporting his plans for a baptismal class Pastor E. F. Coy explained that in Seventh Day Adventist practice a young person in not a church member, even though his parents are, until he has studied the beliefs of the church and has developed a mature concept of the meaning of church membership.

A strong program of Christian development is carried on by the church for its young people, the pastor said. About three thousand missionary volunteer societies in North America help steer the thinking and activities of the youth into positive channels. For junior age children the church conducts Pathfinder clubs, similar to Boy Scouts, with weekly programs and summer training camps.

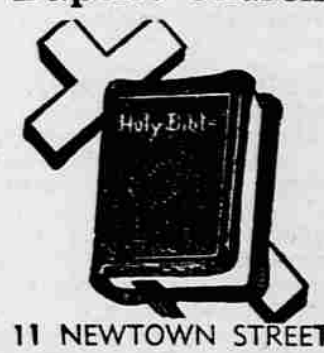
