Nathan Starr Given First Contract for Army Swords

Suddenly aware that I had committed a faux pas in mentioning the Oriental hair-do, I fumbled for a way out.

"George Washington was one. Very short. Not his own hair—at least, when he was well along in years. But John Paul Jones was. And besides, this is a valuable doll."

"My grandmother brought it from China in 1878," Elsie sniffed. "It was new then." Her voice suggested that it was still far too young to have anything but a possible sentimental value.

"I've seen these advertised for \$25—\$50—even more," I protested as Elsie took it back to the bedroom.
