Hong Kong Runway To Jut Out To Sea

Hongkong — (U.P.)—Hongkong authorities have decided to give the British Crown Colony a brand new airport featuring a reinforced runway that juts out into the sea.

According to an official announcement, the construction of the new airport, which in reality is an expansion of the Colony's present Kai Tak airport, will represent the largest single civil engineering contract ever to be undertaken in the colony's history of more than 100 years.

While announcing the large-scale undertaking the government advertised in the Colony's newspapers for contractors to handle the huge project. The advertisement stated that the project is merely the first stage of the development of the present Kai Tak airport.

The main task in stage one will be to reclaim a strip of land adjacent to the present airport on which the new runway will be built. This according to the government, will entail construction of about three and one-fourth miles of seawall. The reclamation project alone will cover some 12,000,000 cubic yards of area. Preliminary plans call for completion of stage one sometime in 1958.

Your Health and Its Care

SIR WILLIAM NEVER SAID IT

A cute little piece eight columns long in a so-called news magazine, with the usual droll "sniffles", comical pictures of patients sneezing or taking foot baths or booze and, of course, a shot of an eminent scientist with some test tubes—oddly enough

he wore no spectacles and there was no microscope in the background—purported to report progress, at last, in the determined fight of the trick scientists to discover the cause and a sure for "the common cold."

Whiskey, brands of which, just incidentally, filled eight columns of the same issue, seems to have no remedial value, the magazine courageously conceded, except that it makes "a fictitious thing called 'the common cold' more endurable."

In order to impart body to this gush of the "news" magazine attributes to Dr. Osler this "prescription":

Hang your hat on the bedpost; climb into bed, and drink whiskey until you can see two hats.

Now I don't believe Dr. Osler ever gave any such prescription or advice. It is probably the invention of an ambitious reporter—as was the story that Dr. Osler advocated chloroforming men at, I forget what age. Just for fun, I hereby promise to pay \$1,000 to the Salvation Army or other human welfare agency which is equally meritorious in my judgment, if any one proves that (1) there is or ever was (even in China) a custom or practice of paying the doctor a regular pittance while one remained well and stopping his pay when one's health was impaired; or (2) that Dr. or Sir William Osler ever seriously prescribed whiskey intoxication for any human ailment.

I'm not facetious about this. Every reader knows that I regard some of Osler's ideas and teachings as bunk. But, even so, Osler was the greatest medical teacher of his day and few if any physicians today have achieved such eminence among their colleagues.

Please do not bother me with quotations from any magazine or newspaper story, or with hearsay or third person interviews.

Wrote Dr. Osler in the sixth edition of his famous *Practice of Medicine*, published in 1906:

Alcohol does not seem to raise the blood pressure in fever, and the studies of Briggs and Cook in my wards would indicate that it is not of value in progressive vasomotor collapse. This does not mean, however, that it may not have value in the fever

(the feverish stage of pneumonia), and I should be sorry to give up its use in the severer forms of enteric (typhoid fever) and pneumonia.

I call that professional quibbling. It reminds me of the quibble of another famous authority, a contemporary of Osler, Dr. Hobart A. Hare, the tenth edition of whose *Textbook of Therapeutics* was published in 1904. In it Dr. Hare said "The chief uses of alcohol are as a rapidly acting stimulant" in heart failure, surgical shock, fainting, snakebite etc. I quote from a letter Prof. Hare wrote me explaining the contradictions:

"It is quite conceivable that alcohol acts as a stimulant upon other functions of which, as yet, we know very little, as, for example, the ability of the body to resist infection."

Conceivable? Yes, and so is a mouse nest in a cat's ear. I wished I had my money back—\$3.75 paid for the book. And I wondered, no fooling, whether I had made a mistake giving six years of my productive life to become a physician.

What did Dr. Hare know about the ability of the body, any body,

to resist infection? What did anyone know about it? What does anyone know about it today?

Nothing.

Since no one knows anything about "resistance" and no one can describe or define such a condition or state clearly enough for anyone else to comprehend what he is trying to say, it is easy for authors of medical textbooks, eminent specialists and ethical quacks to reel off a yard of stereotyped bunk about it

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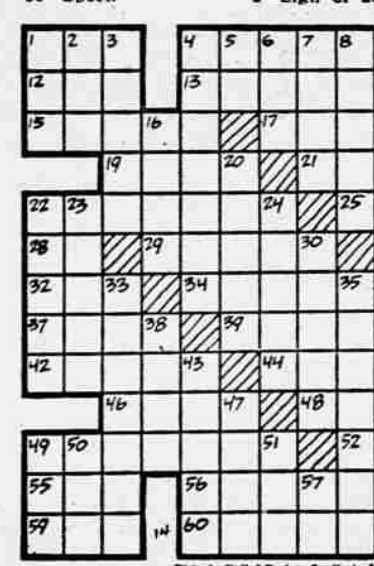
