FIVE THOUSAND AND ONE CASES OF SYPHILIS

I began practice shortly before the close of the era of antiseptic surgery. It was my intention to hang out a

meat sign, such as the big shots in the city used, announcing simply that Wm. Brady, M.D. could be consulted here. The sign painter didn't like it. "You're a doctor, aren't you?" he asked. "Then, why not make it Dr. Wm. Brady?" But I was firm. Didn't the man know what M.D. meant? I called his attention to my diploma and my state license, documents and certifying that I was qualified to practice as physician and surgeon. He seemed reassured. "Oh, I see, well, that's all right then—you go on to the ballgame and we'll have the sign finished when you get back." So that's how I scared away at the very outset—when I returned to the office there was the sign telling the world that Wm. Brady, M.D. was both "Surgeon and Physician."

Time passed. I never knew so much time to pass so quietly. Nobody seemed to want any surgery. Well, if I was a surgeon I might as well arrange the setting to suit. I persuaded a hopeful dealer to install an outfit of white enameled steel and plate glass surgical fixtures. Then I waited another year or two. Finally a debonaire youth took a chance—perhaps he preferred to avoid the doctors he knew—and I took his history. I was unable to make a positive diagnosis at once—remember, it was before the discovery of Treponema pallidum (syphilis germ) or the dark-field microscopic test—but the young man, assuring me it could be nothing, for he moved only among the best people, agreed to return in forty-eight hours. When he returned, there was no longer any doubt. I told him he had syphilis, and he fainting, cutting a gash in his head and smashing the plate glass top of my instrument table as he fell.

The patient followed my instructions well for a while. But as soon as the chancre (primary sore) had nearly faded he grew skeptical, and when no characteristic skin rash or sores in the mouth appeared in the next few

Money Needed To Combat Budworm

Washington — (U.P.) — There is an "urgent need" for a large budworm control program to forestall the threatened destruction of nearly \$38,000,000 worth of timber in Oregon, Idaho, Montana and New Mexico.

The Forest service has reported to congress that it needs \$2,570,000 to pay the federal government's share of an extermination program. An estimated 12,300,000,000 board feet of timber are threatened, the service said.

"Natural control factors" failed to develop to curb the spruce budworms, the service said, and consequently the 1954 season "has been exceptionally favorable to a greatly expanded budworm activity."

Douglas fir trees are hardest hit, the service said. Budworms feed on needles and buds of both fir and spruce trees. Those trees not killed by the worms, are so weakened as to be easy victims of bark beetles.

Extermination is done most effectively by spraying affected areas from airplanes while budworm larvae are feeding.
