

**Plan Conference For Older Girls**

The 1955 Oregon Older Girls conference will be held at Menucha conference grounds near Portland Friday, March 25, through Sunday, March 27. This weekend is sponsored annually by the Oregon Council of Church Women to foster and develop Christian leadership and character. "Joyous Christian living" is the theme for this year's conference.

Miss Dorothy Harding, director of Wesley Foundation on the University of Oregon campus, will be the guest speaker for the weekend. Workshops on daily living, music, religious drama, art, vocations, teaching in the church, and worship will give the girls essential foundation material to use in their own churches. Exchange students from several nations will compose a panel on "Christian Girls at Work in Other Lands."

President of the Conference, Miss Joyce Hill, at Willamette university, Salem, and the conference director, Dr. Freeda Hartzfeld, dean of women at Lewis and Clark college, Portland, hope that many will attend. The cost is \$9.50 (\$7 for meals, \$1 for travel pool, and \$1.50 for registration). Inquiries and registration are to be made through Miss Una Davies, Multnomah college, Portland. Any girl in Oregon of high school or college age is invited to attend the 1955 Oregon Older Girls conference.
