



Margaret Selby posed for a "mood" picture holding a bunch of grapes which matched the purple satin of the wrap she wore over her white Roman gown.

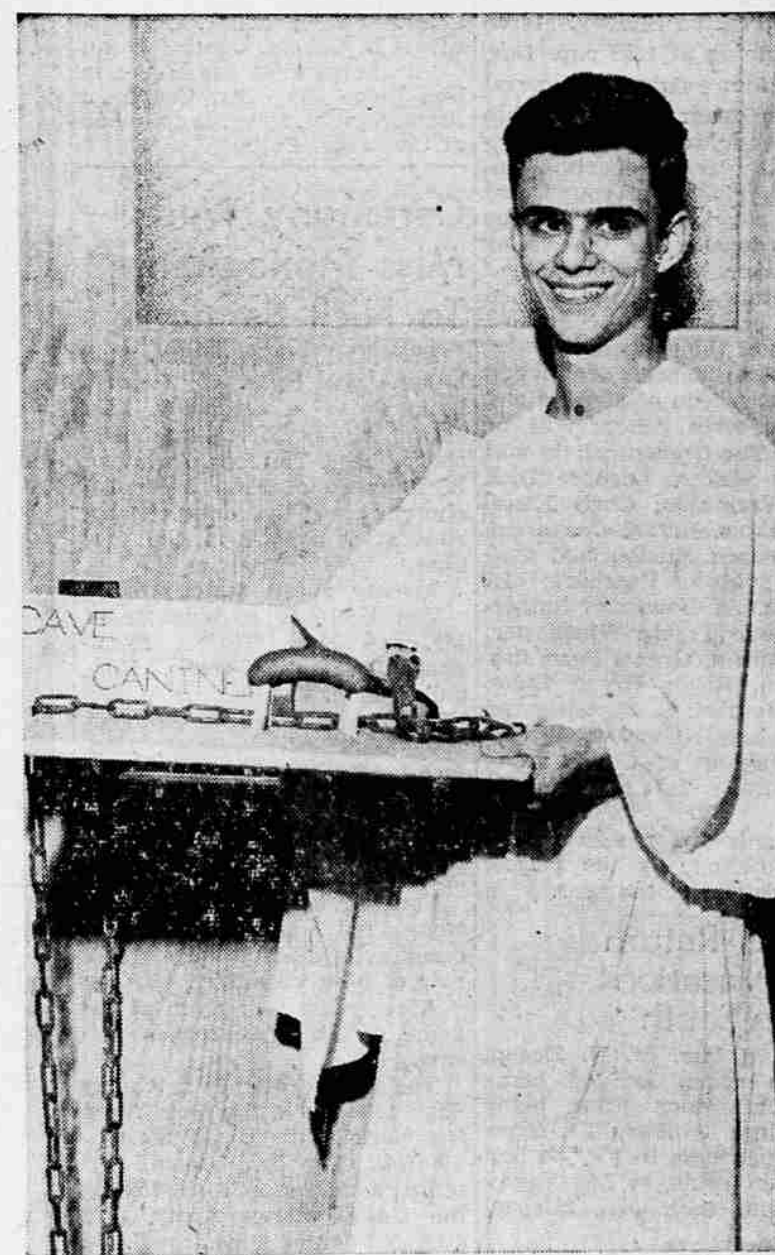
