Portlander Selected Weekly Disease List Oregon Mother of '55 Rises to 70 Cases

Portland — (U.P.) — Mrs. Florence Naomi Brinks of Portland was named today as Oregon's Mother for 1955.

Mrs. Brinks, widow of Rev. James Brinks, was selected from among nine finalists here. She has nine children ranging in age from 15 to 30.

The Portland widow was born in Olathe, Kan., the second child of a railroad engineer.

She will represent Oregon in the national American Mother competition in May, according to Mrs. H. E. Woodward, chairman of the mother selection committee.

The number of communicable disease cases reported to the public health department last week rose to 70, the largest number this year.

Chicken pox, which has led the list of cases for many weeks, did so again, with a total of 28, with 24 of them in Medford.

Measles were second, with 24 cases, more than half of them in Medford.

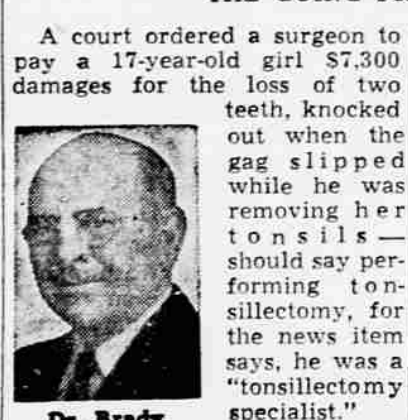

THE GOING PRICE OF TEETH

On p. 10 of Little Lesson No. 1, Save Your Teeth, for which send 25c and stamped, self-addressed envelope, and may I remind you poor geeks who squander your money instead of buying the dentistry everyone should have, that it is not the first lesson just by chance, I say:

For every tooth lost and not immediately replaced by a functionally satisfactory denture, one must deduct two years from one's life expectancy.

Perhaps I should have said one SHOULD or one may as well deduct two years for every tooth lost. Of course it isn't a certainty. Awfully some persons continue breathing for months or years after they have lost most or all of their teeth, and, to my embarrassment, there was the fellow who won the marathon race up Pike's Peak without wearing his plates.

At the end of No. 1 Little Lesson in the Ways of Health I say: I consider every functionally efficient tooth, real or artificial, worth one hundred thousand cents.

The news item did not indicate whether the court awarded \$3,650 per tooth per se or, say, just \$1,000 per tooth and the balance for construction, maintenance and repair of whatever dentures may be required in the next fifty years.

Let no casual reader infer that these comments are facetious. In my opinion the best assurance of health, good digestion, good looks, vete and longevity one can inherit or buy is a full complement of functionally efficient teeth. And so I contend that, regardless of what some physician

arbitrarily "orders" or misguided patient requests, a good dentist will not extract a tooth if there is a reasonable chance of saving it by proper treatment.

In the pamphlet on Yankee Stomach (for which send stamped, self-addressed envelope), which deals with heartburn, hunger pain, bloating by gas, hyperacidity, etc., I say:

I do not contend that if all your teeth are in good functional condition you will be

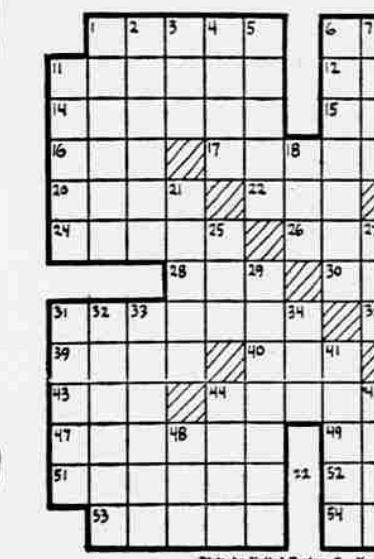

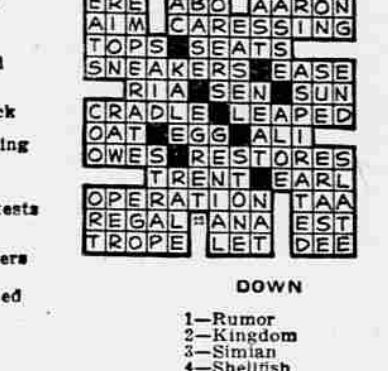

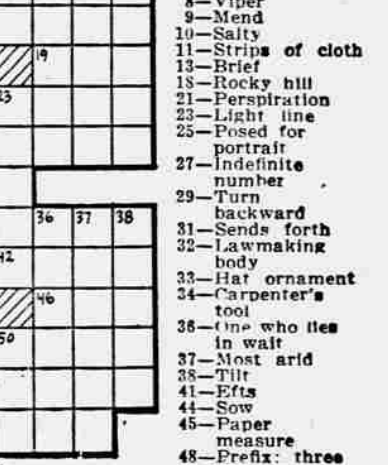
