Salem — (U.P.) — The House Fish and Game committee has given support to the State Game mission in the latter's decision not to feed deer in the Baker area of eastern Oregon where many animals died because of a winter feed shortage.

The committee wrote the commission saying it supported the game body's stand "that only in the most extreme circumstances should deer be artificially fed."

Rep. Robert J. Steward of Baker county, a member of the committee, said the letter was intended to back the commission against "minority group" pressure.

readers, I am convinced that calcium deficiency is the main predisposing cause of this hypersensitive state.

Whether more persons are allergic to this and that nowadays than in the past is debatable. From a casual view one readily infers that a larger portion of the population is affected today, but this offhand impression is invalidated by two pertinent facts—first, that physicians today diagnose allergy in thousands of cases which formerly would not have been so recognized; and second, that sophomorphs who have learned to say "definitely" when they mean yes, no or I believe so have learned also to allude smartly to "complexes," "ulcers" and "allergies."

This is a dinky little piece but hard to write. I have dawdled for many hours over it, trying to decide whether it would do some people good yet do others no harm.

Often, says Dr. Warren T. Vaughn, M.D., Primer of Allergy, nasal allergy is erroneously regarded as sinus trouble. A person who says "I catch cold all the time" or "I hardly get over one cold before I get another" is likely to be suffering from nasal allergy. In nasal allergy the secretion is more likely to be thin and watery, while in sinus disease it is more apt to be thick, whitish or yellowish.

It is in just such cases of chronic sinus trouble that I recommend correction of calcium

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deficiency by supplementing the ordinary diet with a daily ration of calcium and D, as I explain in Little Lesson 26, The Calcium Shortage, for which booklet send 25c and stamped, self-addressed envelope. This is not medicine, no treatment. It is merely better nutrition and it must be followed for months or every day the year around, at least until the everyday diet is planned to insure an adequate intake of calcium and vitamin D.

Frequently I hear from some knucklehead that he has "tried taking calcium" as he says I suggested, and it did no good. I do not suggest that you "try" calcium. I suggest that you eat it every day for not less than three or four months, and along with

it of course a sufficient amount of sunshine vitamin D to insure assimilation and normal metabolism of the calcium. That vitamin D promotes calcium utilization in the body is a bit of physiology which some doctors have not yet learned.

Leg ache or pain that merely "bothers" may be due to prolonged vitamin B complex deficiency. To prevent or correct such deficiency, eat whole wheat in place of refined white flour. Plain wheat, oatmeal, dried beans, dried peas, soy beans, wheat germ, wheat bran, lean pork, ham, bacon, nuts, and peanuts are the richest food sources of vitamin B complex.

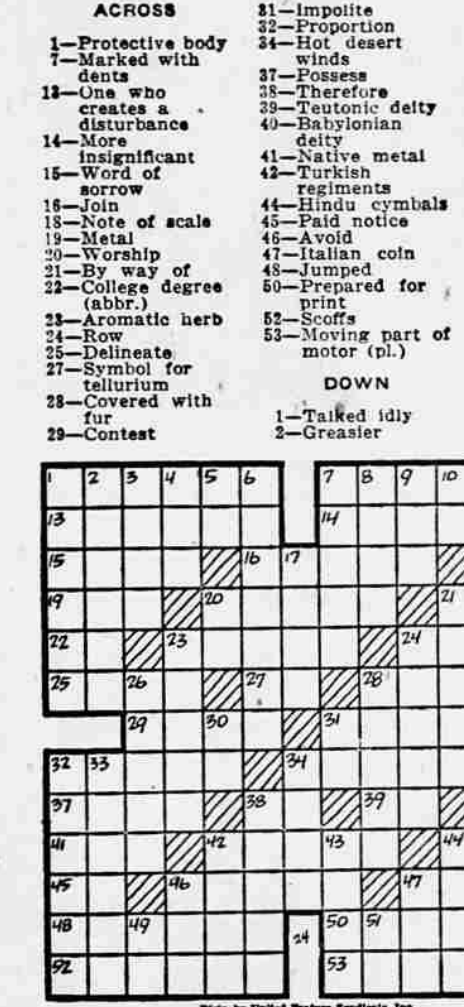
