

Reparation Week Will Open Sunday At Sacred Heart

A week of religious devotions, known as the "Week of Reparation," will be conducted at the Sacred Heart church beginning Sunday, March 27. This series of religious exercises is a "very recent spontaneous outgrowth of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus," church officials commented.

Though this type of devotion has been conducted in the eastern part of the country, Medford is the first city in the west to sponsor them. This is the second successive year that the sessions have been conducted here.

The opening time for the service Sunday will be 7:30 p.m., with a Holy hour of benediction, sermons, hymns and acts of reparation. Similar services will be held at the same hour Monday through Friday.

Daily masses on the weekdays will be at 6:30 and 8 a.m., and at 7:30 p.m., beginning with a Holy hour. Holy Communion will be distributed at 7:50 a.m., and a sermon will follow the 8 a.m. weekly mass.

Washington — (U.P.) — Rep. Harris Ellsworth (R-Ore.) today said he planned to meet with Linn and Lane flood control officials early in April to discuss the Green Peter and Cougar Dam projects.

Rep. Ellsworth has introduced bills authorizing "partnership" construction of the two dams, located in the Willamette Valley. The Bureau of the Budget recommended \$1,000,000 to start work on Green Peter, and \$2,000,000 for Cougar, if the measure is passed.
