

Radioactive Fallout Subject of Many Complaints, Mostly Unfounded; Compared to Soot From Furnace

Washington — (U.P.) — A businessman complained that fallout from atomic weapons tests in Nevada was making his employees sick. A taxi driver said his tires were getting sticky from radioactivity, Moscow blamed droughts in Russia on atomic fallout from America.

It's about the same with fallout. Dust which is sucked into an atomic explosion gets "hot," or radioactive. But the hot dust cools off fast, losing a great deal of its radioactivity in a few minutes, practically all within a few hours. If the dust is light, like soot, it would be harmless by the time it settled to earth.

This is the kind of fallout that we've been getting from atomic weapons tests in Nevada. It doesn't hurt anybody. Heavier dust is dangerous. But atomic explosions also can suck up heavier dust, like hot cinders. This happens when an H bomb is exploded so close to earth its fireball scoops out a crater in the ground. The dust that goes up is heavier and therefore it falls back to earth pretty fast.

The greatest danger would be from fallout downwind from the center of the explosion. Like soot, atomic dust is carried whichever way the wind is blowing. Downwind from an atomic explosion you would have to be at least 220 miles away to be sure you wouldn't be killed by fallout.

This is why protection against fallout is becoming an important phase of civil defense planning in America.

Moderation By Press During Labor Disputes in Scandinavia Noted by Mail Tribune Writer

Helsinki, Finland — (By Mail) — The newspapers' role in a major labor dispute in Scandinavia is much different from that in the United States.

Sweden has just escaped the threat of the worst strike in its history. Yet only Communist press took a strong editorial stand, denouncing the employers that might well have been borrowed from American "strike language."

In general the press coverage of labor disputes in Scandinavia is a cool summary of facts. Little space is devoted to a situation which is still hatching. Criticism of the various Scandinavian governments—all Labor except in Finland—is particularly temperate in labor matters. Scandinavian labor does not have Labor members in parliament hog tied. They appear to be less exposed to pressure groups of labor and management than is the case in the United States where a labor legislator rarely votes against union policies.

Atomic-Artillery Task Force Plans Test of Guided Missile

Las Vegas — (U.P.) — A joint atomic-artillery task force laid plans today for stratospheric tests of an atomic tipped guided missile which could wipe out potential enemy bomber fleets even with a near miss.

The Atomic Energy commission and the Department of Defense announced an atomic warhead carried by a guided missile would be detonated in the "thousands of feet" in the air above the Nevada desert test site in a simulated attack on an "enemy" bomber formation.

The agencies did not announce a date for the stratospheric explosion. Earlier reports indicated such a device would be detonated during the 1955 test series.



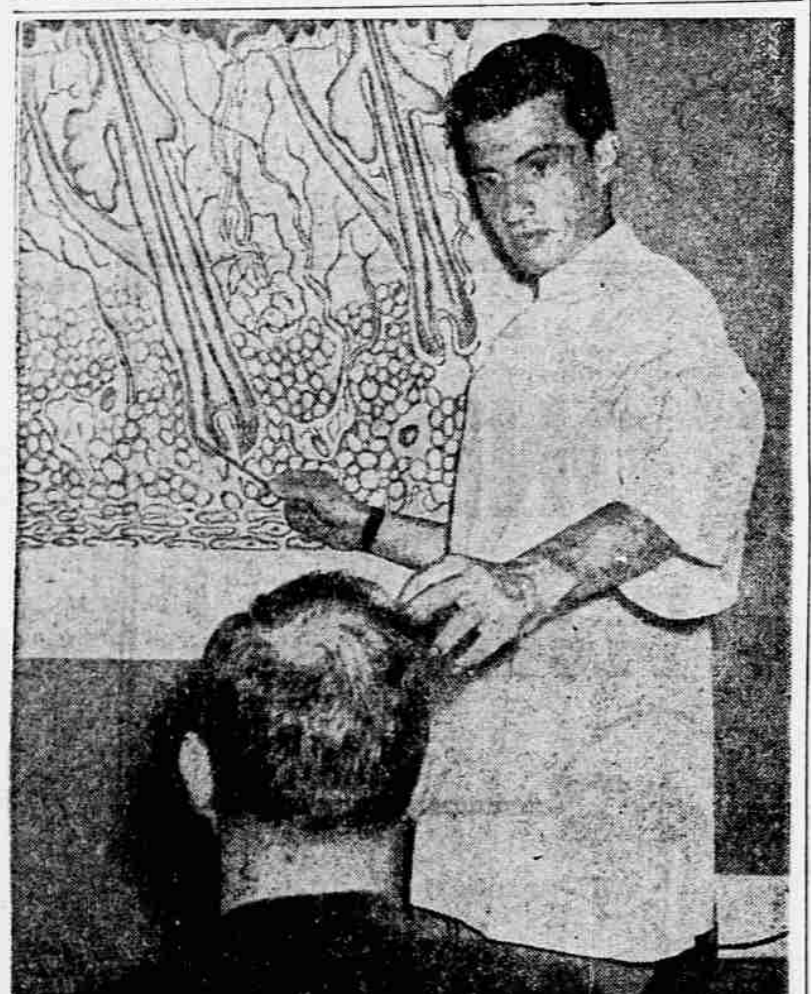
