160 Persons Given X-Rays This Week

Some 160 persons received chest x-rays Wednesday and Thursday at the two Medford hospitals in the recently inaugurated program of the Jackson County Public Health association.

Out-patient x-ray clinics are held at Community hospital Wednesday afternoons and at Sacred Heart hospital Thursday afternoons. Several hundred people have been x-rayed so far this year.

One case of tuberculosis has been discovered through the use of the x-rays, it was reported today, and arrangements are being made for his admittance to the state TB sanitarium in Salem. Dr. A. Erin Merkel, county health officer, pointed out that the x-rays are the fastest and surest way of discovering the 100 or more undetected cases of TB in the county, and eradicating the disease.
