Free Methodists Slate Missionary

Miss Geneva Sayre, Portland, furloughing missionary from Formosa, will speak Sunday, at 11 a. m., at the Free Methodist church, 10th and Ivy sts.

Miss Sayre, at one time a prisoner of the Communists in China, has served two years as missionary on the island of Formosa.

She spent many years in China, serving as evangelist, teacher and medical worker in the cities of Kihhsien, Kaifeng and Chengchow in Honan Province. When the Japanese invaded China, she was interned for nearly two years and the last six months of her internment were spent in a large Japanese concentration camp.

In 1946 Miss Sayre returned to the Free Methodist Mission in Honan province, but in the fall of 1948 the Communists gained full control of Honan and some time later she was placed under arrest.

Upon her release she went to Hong Kong, where she served about six months in a camp of 20,000 refugees who had fled from Communist China. In 1952 she proceeded to Formosa to begin Free Methodist mission work there.

She brings with her Kodachrome slides and moving pictures. All are invited to hear Miss Sayre.

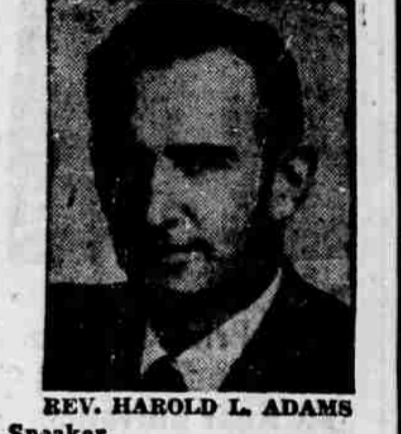

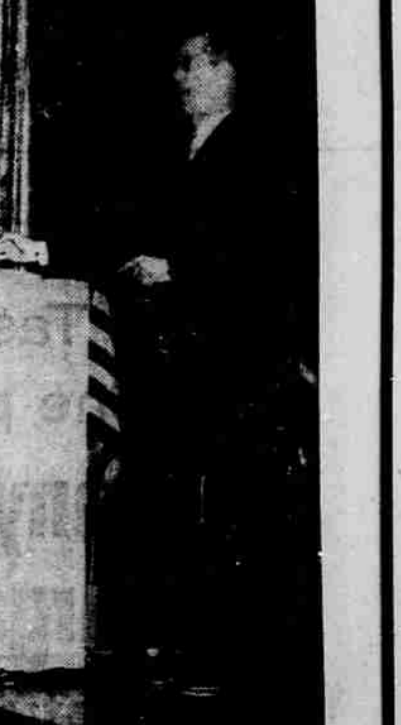
