Your Health and Its Care

MAY I MAKE ONE MORE PLEA FOR THAT CHERISHED DEGREE?

Including less than two years of internship in the Erie County Hospital in Buffalo, I engaged in general practice for eight years before I turned quick—that is, broke into the newspapers. I turned because I found it impossible to make a decent living for my family from honest practice.

Although I never became successful in the popular sense of the word, I do not deem the eighteen years wasted. It seems reasonable that the experience I gained in eighteen honest years may have served me in good stead since I started conducting a health column—a say health, not medical column.

Health columning might well be recognized as a specialty and the doctor who takes up the specialty should be required to have had not less than ten years of experience in general practice and perhaps that degree which so many readers failed to interpret when we invited readers to try—the degree P. H. D., Doctor of Personal Health. More than 500 answers were received, and 106 of them were correct. In view of the facts—namely, that the official title of this column, feature or department in Personal Health Service (and the title of my book (never, never again) was Personal Health; and the notice which accompanies every piece I write for this column, that I answer questions pertaining to personal health and hygiene, not to disease, diagnosis or treatment—I was disappointed, but then, why should people know about a degree that has never been granted an educational institution? I simply had a pipe dream in which a university awarded me the degree in recognition of—oh, all right, but I do seriously believe medical schools should have undergraduate departments and postgraduate courses for physicians who intend to limit their practice to personal health.

The practice of the P. H. D. would embrace not only prevention of disease but, what is more important, the building and maintenance of health, vito, functional efficiency.

In China, as licensed liars have been telling us since Confucius got into popular parlance, people stop paying the doctor when they become ill. In this country people have not learned, probably never will learn to pay a doctor for keeping them well. But I still like to dream that I'm a P. H. D. (and this isn't Ph. D., sophomore—and with a lucrative private practice.

You should draw the line for the sake of your children's health, and do not defer to that argument that "all the other kids do." All the other kids are going the nambypamby way.

Enough Storage For Grain Seen

Spokane — (U.P.) — It appears certain there will be enough storage space available by harvest time to handle the 1955 Pacific Northwest wheat crop, Pete Stallcop, executive secretary of the Pacific Northwest Grain Dealers association, said Friday.

Stallcop said he had believed there would be a severe space shortage but changed his mind after receiving recent information.

"It now appears there will be little or no difficulty in handling the 1955 harvest providing the railroads can furnish sufficient box cars to move the carryover from country positions to terminal positions prior to harvest," he said.

Present information indicates the new crop will be about the size of last year's and will require 80,000,000 bushels of storage not in existence last year, he said. That much space is in sight, he added.

He said 51,000,000 bushels can be stored in new space at Army engineer warehouses at Pasco, 75 additional ships at Astoria and 30 at Olympia. The other 20,000,000 bushels of the crop probably will be exported, he said.

Pennsylvania leads in raw steel production and blast furnaces and is followed in order by Ohio, Indiana and Illinois, but some other states rank well, too.
