Dean-Hussane Wrestling Bout Expected To Pack 'em in at Merrick's Saturday

Wrestle fans are expected to jam Merrick's arena tomorrow night to see Man Mountain Dean Jr., said to be the world's largest grappler, when he faces Yoggi Hussane in the main event of Mack Lillard's weekly mat offering. The 30-year-old Dean, who hails from Stone Mountain, Ga., was taught the tricks of the trade by his late uncle, the original Man Mountain Dean, and is said to have improved on many of the old boy's spectacular tactics.

Dean's pet maneuver is a flying body press which he calls a "belly flop." Opponents have long sought to have officials bar the dangerous maneuver but it has been ruled strictly legitimate. He sets a foe up for the "belly flop" by battering him to the mat and while he is in a dazed condition Dean leaps into the air and hurls his 380 pounds full force onto the unlucky one. Besides being a top flight matster, Dean is widely known for his feats of strength. He is said to delight in matching his

And the other famous entries were mighty worried, because 32-year-old Jackie showed no intentions of "blowing" his surprising lead.

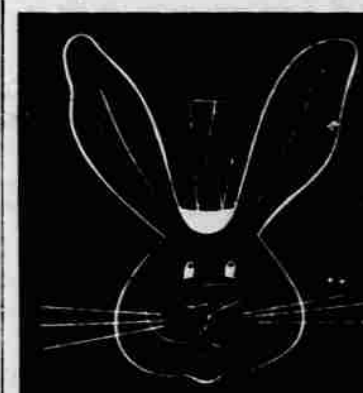

STALEMATE

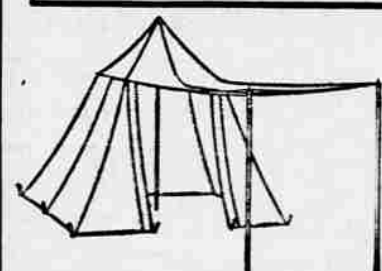
