Mrs. George Goodrich Praised for Service To Blind in Red Cross

Mrs. George Goodrich has resigned as chairman of the Red Cross committee which has been working with the blind, it was announced at a meeting of the local Red Cross chapter Thursday.

Mrs. John Day, chairman of volunteer services, announced the resignation, and praised Mrs. Goodrich for her work which has resulted in the local chapter receiving national attention for its work with the blind. Mrs. Harry Poston has been named to succeed Mrs. Goodrich, Mrs. Day said.

Six classes in first aid are now in progress in the county, with several more being formed in the next few weeks, it was re-

ported by Leroy Williams, first aid chairman.

Elliott Becken reported on a recent meeting of the County Council of Social Agencies, and reported that one of the council's aims is to make known the duties and responsibilities of each agency. A brochure is planned which will set forth details of all services supplied by the Red Cross and other groups.

Mrs. Frank Fairweather, vice-chairman of the chapter, said that a good portion of important Red Cross work is of a confidential nature and cannot be made public. As an illustration, she said \$4000 was spent last year for communications alone—messages to servicemen overseas, attempts to have them returned to the states for family emergencies, and so on.

Mrs. Joseph Burba reported on the bloodmobile visit Wednesday which brought in 276 pints, or 38 more than the quota. It is the first time the quota has been exceeded in more than six months, she said.

A new film, "Prescription for Life," telling the story of how blood from blood donations is used, was shown.

West Germany Adds To Trucker Subsidy

Berlin—(U.P.)—The West German government has voted additional subsidies to truckers to pay the exorbitant highway taxes levied by the Communists in their pocketbook blockade of West Berlin.

Confronted by prolonged Communist haggling over the tolls, the government raised its subsidies from \$125,000 to \$187,000 for West German truckers who supply most of Berlin's food on the 110-mile run through Communist territory.

This was in addition to a subsidy of \$250,000 already authorized by the West Berlin government, a total of \$437,500 in "taxes" the Communists said were needed to repair the highways.

The Communists warned again Friday that ratification of the Paris pacts to rearm West Germany would have "dangerous results" for West Berlin but they did not elaborate on the new threat.

Physical Education Bill Passes House

Salem—(U.P.)—The House has followed the lead of the Senate and passed a bill wiping out the statutory requirement that Oregon schools provide physical education courses.

The vote was 38 to 16. Rep. Wayne Giesy (R-Monroe) said the Legislature should not require the teaching of physical education any more than it does the teaching of mathematics or history. That should be left up to educators, he said.

Salem—(U.P.)—The House has passed and sent to the Senate a bill which sets forth grounds on which the State Racing Commission can deny dog or horse racing licenses. At present the commission has authority to deny such licenses but does not set forth reasons for which a license may be denied.

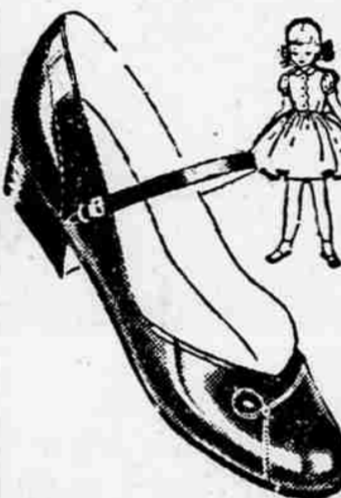
