Colorado River Swimmers Sought

Grand Canyon, Ariz. — (U.P.) — The sheriff's office at Flagstaff, Ariz., was alerted today to look for two Los Angeles men who reportedly started a week ago to swim a portion of the Colorado river.

The two men were identified as William K. Beer, 25, and John Daggett, 27.

Preston Patrow, superintendent of Grand Canyon National Park said he had received a request for search for the two men from Mrs. Sidney J. Graham, San Diego, an aunt of Beer.

Mrs. Graham said the two planned swimming from Marble Canyon to Phantom Ranch in Grand Canyon. She said they were to have arrived at Bright Angel Creek yesterday.

Russians Threaten Protests to U.N.

Moscow — (U.P.) — Russia has threatened to protest to the United Nations that the United States and Britain are trying to "pressure" near the middle Eastern Nations into Western-dominated military alliances.

The Russian statement was made at a Foreign Ministry news conference. It said the Soviet Union will lodge a protest with the United Nations unless alleged American and British "pressure" in the near and middle East is stopped.

The Soviet Union accused the two Western Powers of taking "measures calculated to involve by a devious way, singly or two at a time, the countries of the near and middle East in this or that grouping created under their domination."

WHY DISSECT THE THROAT?

Certainly I have no more skill or knowledge in the matter of enlargement (hypertrophy) of the tonsils or infection of the tonsils than any doctor has or should have. On the other hand I profess to know as much about enlarged or infected tonsils as most doctors do.

The atrocious major operation called "tonsillectomy" (complete removal of the tonsil) is really only aggravated, gorified (bloody) tonsillotomy (removal of part of the tonsil), for statistics show that in most instances portions of tonsil remain in the throat after recovery—if the victim recovers—from "tonsillectomy."

Genuine tonsillectomy—removal of the obstructing portion of the tonsil—is a minor operation, as instantaneous and as safe as extraction of a tooth, rarely if ever giving rise to serious complications or consequences.

The aim and boast of the ever-ready operators of yesterday, that "tonsillectomy gets every bit of tonsil, whereas tonsillotomy merely slices off part of the tonsil" betrays ignorance of pathology. The only conceivable justification for the attempt to "get every bit of tonsil" would be knowledge or at least suspicion that tonsil tissue is malignant or otherwise harmful or dangerous. This is absurd. Yet it is the stock sales argument of the perpetrators of tonsillectomy, despite the fact that portions of tonsil remain in the throat after the atrocity, no matter who commits it.

How many children die on the operating table or following this unwarranted operation we can only surmise, for the perpetrators and the institutions where it occurs conspire to conceal the facts from the public. But in some cases the child's death is associated with "removal of the tonsils" even though the "authorities" try to blame it on "cardiac arrest," shock, hemorrhage, embolism, aspiration pneumonia, etc.

"Cardiac arrest" means simply that the heart has stopped beating. A bit of inanity that impresses some customers.

Embolism means that a bit of blood clot or a bit of tonsil or throat tissue gets into an open vessel and is carried in the blood to lodge in lung, brain or other distant area, shutting off the circulation to the area.

Aspiration pneumonia means lung inflammation produced by foreign matter getting into the breathing passages and lodging in the lung where it sets up inflammation.

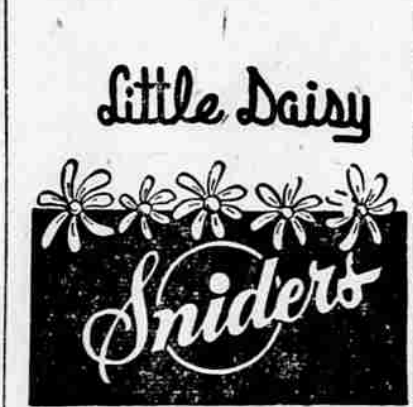

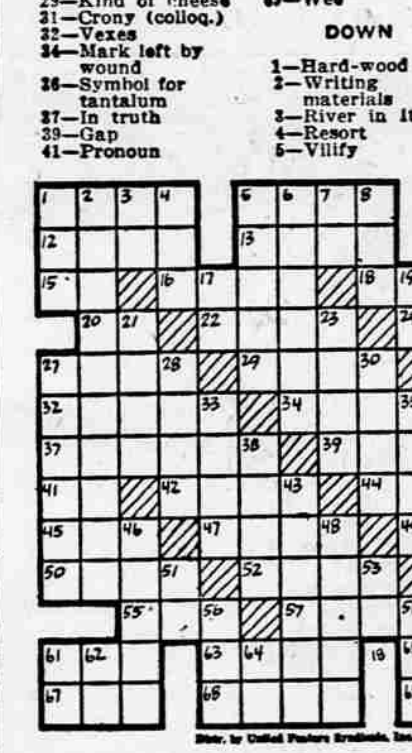

Depoe Bay, Ore. — (U.P.) — Three men and a woman were rescued from the 28-foot troller "The Alice" Saturday minutes before it broke up on the rocks near the channel entrance to Depoe Bay. The Coast Guard took Hugh and Keith Cook, both of Sheridan, Ore., and Raymond Deuel and his wife, Clara, of Otis, Ore., off the boat by lifeline and a ring buoy.

Direct shipping was established this year between landlocked Paraguay and the United States. Previously goods aboard deep-sea vessels were transferred at Buenos Aires or Montevideo to river boats and railroads. River channels have been improved and small freighters now go from the Atlantic up the Rio de la Plata, the Parana, and the Paraguay.
