

Congressmen See Victory by Ike In 1956 Election

Washington — (U.P.) — Three Republican congressmen told one of President Eisenhower's aides at a White House conference that they are convinced the President "will run and win in 1956."

The three, Reps. Albert W. Cretella (Conn.), Alvain R. Bush (Pa.) and H. R. Gross (Ia.), expressed their views to Homer H. Gruenther, a presidential assistant on legislative liaison. They were called to the White House yesterday for a lunch conference and "a general discussion" on a variety of subjects.

Cretella said the discussion touched on Republican party unity, the postal pay raise bill, the farm program and other domestic matters.

"The discussion was not pinpointed to any particular subject," Cretella said. "But there was optimism about Mr. Eisenhower's popularity. We expressed the conviction that Mr. Eisenhower will run, and win,

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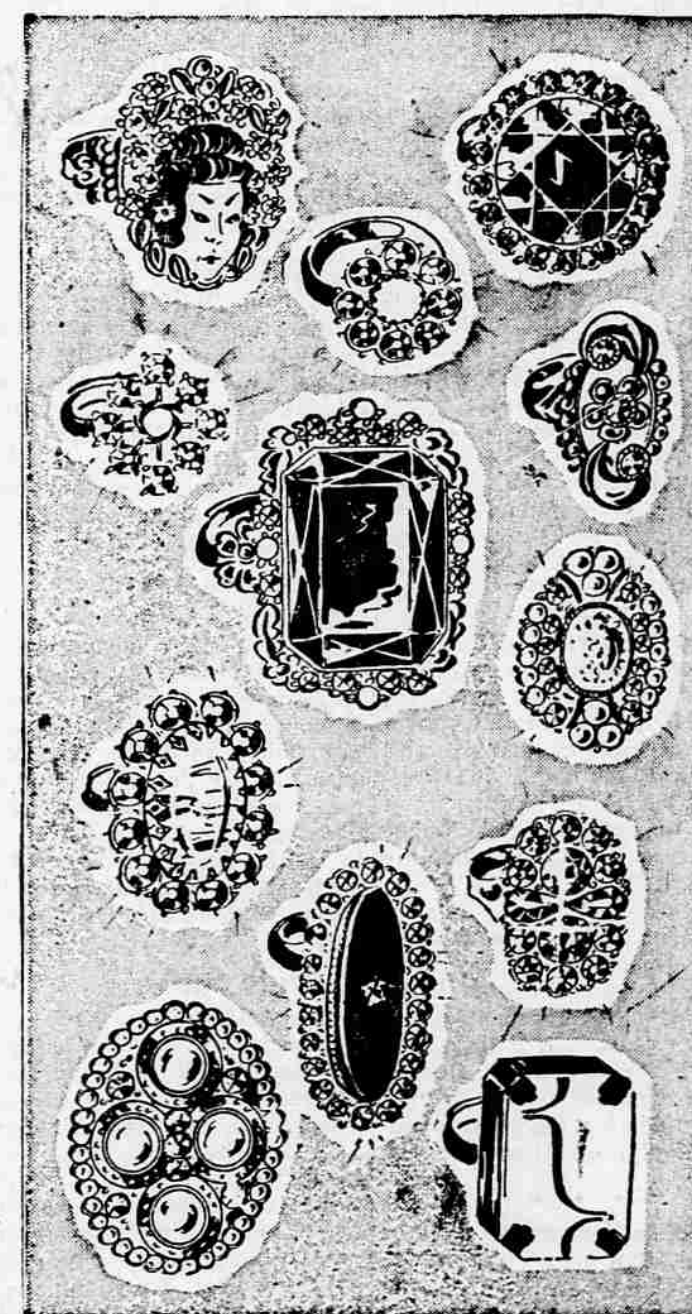
