Washington Piles Up High Score In Grade Meet; 4 Records Fall

Washington nabbed one division, tied in another and ran up 99 1/4 points yesterday to gain top total in the annual all-city grade school track and field meet which saw four records broken and one tied.

Roosevelt with 94 1/4 counters wasn't far behind Washington in total score, also winning a division and deadlocking with the meet victors in the other. The Roosevelt thincads also won the medley relay. Jackson and Lincoln each tallied 35 1/4.

Victor in Class A was Roosevelt with 24 1/4. Other scores were Washington 20 1/4, Jackson 19 1/4 and Lincoln 19 1/4. Washington and Roosevelt each picked up 40 in Class B. Jackson got 6 and Lincoln 5. In Class C Washington had 39 to 30 for Roosevelt while Lincoln had 11 1/2 and Jackson 10 1/2.

The 220-yard run record fell in two classes yesterday as Monroe, Roosevelt, zipped the distance in :29.4 in Class B and Lowry-raced the Class C event in :29.8. Hamilton, Jackson, had run the B race in :29.5 last year while Monroe had a 1954 mark of :30.9 competing in C.

The Class B 220 relay club from Washington, Ayres, Elkins, Davis and Ragsdale, romped through that event in :28.8. The old mark was :28.9 set in 1952 and equalled in that year and in 1953. McIntyre Roosevelt, leaped 15 feet 8 inches in the Class B broad jump to eclipse the 15-3 1/2 standard set by Cabler, Washington, in 1952.

McIntyre, also tied his 1954 mark in the 60-yard dash in his B division with a :07.9 effort.

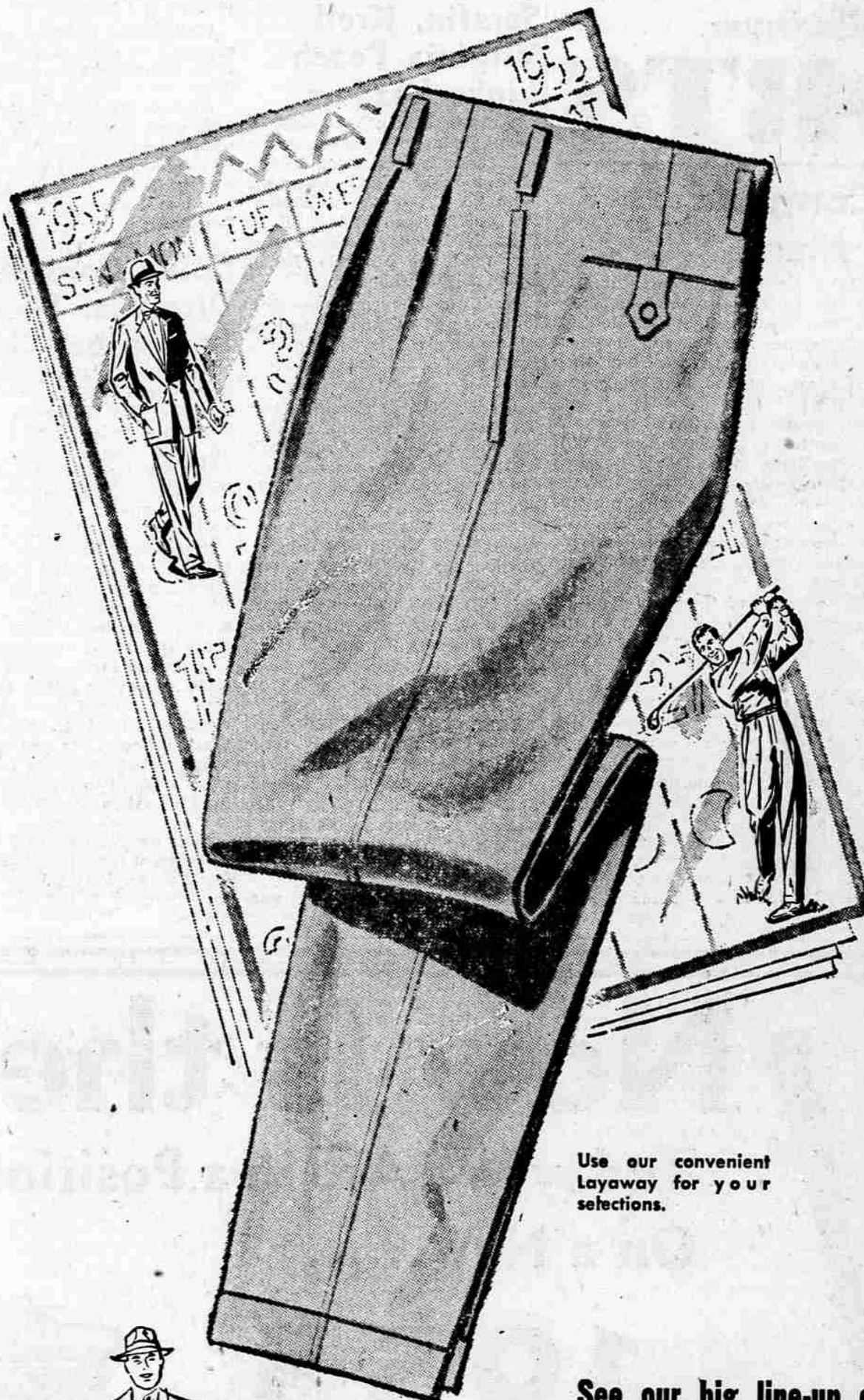
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
