Mrs. Stancliffe will participate in a panel discussion regarding chapter size.

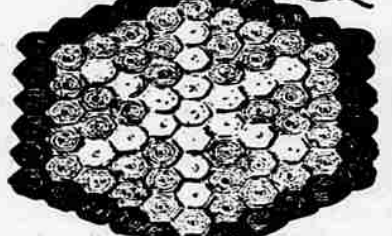
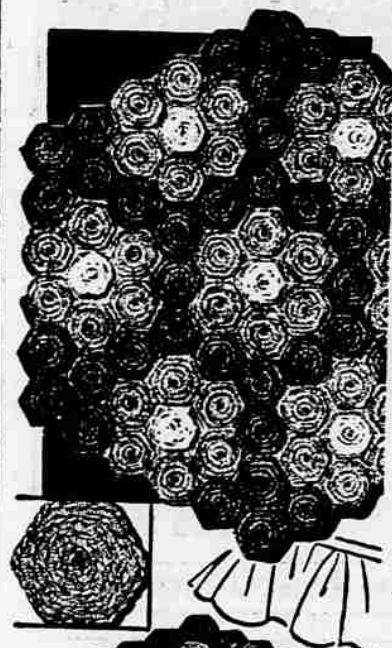
Groups to Hold Ride on Sunday
