

Assembly Youth at Jacksonville Will Conduct Services

Jacksonville — The Youth of the Assembly of God Church in Jacksonville will join some 86 thousand young people of Assemblies of God churches throughout the United States Sunday, April 24, in observance of the ninth National Christ's ambassadors day.

Sunday services will feature members of the local CA group headed by the president, Mrs. Harry Belau.

The observance will launch a nation wide reading of the Book of Acts for the youth group at the Jacksonville Assembly of God, as well as at some 6,000 other Assemblies of God churches of the U.S. The national office in Springfield, Mo., expects to circulate 50,000 copies of the Book of Acts on Sunday with the opening of the reading project.
