Student Drivers Get Lower Rates

Washington — (U.P.) — High school students who pass a course in driver education are now entitled to a 10 per cent reduction in their auto insurance, the National Bureau of Casualty Underwriters has announced. The reduction is effective in 39 states and the District of Columbia.

"Driver education courses offered by 10,000 of the nation's high schools are paying dividends," said William G. Carr, executive secretary of the National Education Association.

"Insurance companies, schools and the public need assurance that a minimum program of instruction is being offered in high school driver education. The recently announced plan (10 per cent reduction) indicates that preferred rates will be allowed graduates . . . where the state department of education certifies that at least 30 hours of classroom instruction and six hours of driving time were given."

Only about 25 per cent of eligible high school students are receiving both classroom and practice driving in 7,000 high schools. Another 25 per cent receive only classroom instruction in 3,000 high schools.

"This means that 50 per cent, about 1,000,000 students, come of licensable age every year without any driver education," Carr stressed.

Since 1933, when a few high schools started to teach driver education, it has helped to reduce the number of deaths per 100,000,000 miles of vehicle travel, from 15.6 in 1933 to 7.1 in 1953.

"If we don't pay now to equip our boys and girls with safe driving through high school courses, we will pay later—for countless accidents," Carr added.

Give A Child A Break

The physician, surgeon or throat specialist who says or implies that tonsillectomy is not a dangerous operation does not tell the truth.

The truth is that in every instance tonsillectomy is a major operation, involving risk of death. Good news I'd rather not have to say this, but tonsillectomy is fatal to many victims in the course of a year.

If this operation were really necessary or if it were more effective than the minor operation, tonsillectomy, for enlarged tonsils in children one might not feel duty bound to talk about it here.

Having studied the question intensively for many years, with due regard for mortality rates, I am convinced that the more or less blind dissection of the throat known as tonsillectomy does nothing for the child with enlarged (hypertrophic) tonsils that tonsillectomy won't do as well.

Tonsillectomy means clipping, slicing off the obstructing portion of tonsil, which is as quickly over and attended with no greater danger than attends extraction of a tooth.

For years I have contended that there is no good reason why an operator should attempt to "get every bit of tonsil tissue" when operating for enlarged

tonsils; no sign of infection (septic foci) in 930.

If the "indication" or reason for it is to eradicate or clear up a septic focus deemed responsible for some systemic trouble, a safer alternative will serve the purpose, provided the operator has the skill to apply it. I refer to electro-coagulation (surgical diathermy).

The diathermy method is not applicable to children's tonsils—children under seven years of age will not or cannot co-operate with the doctor, as a rule. But no matter—the method of choice for children whose breathing passages are obstructed by enlarged tonsils is tonsillectomy—tonsil clipping—slicing off the obstructing portion with the ton-

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Gelatin
Does gelatin contain all the essential nutrients found in meat? Can't get my husband to eat meat, so I am trying to supply the essential complete proteins in other foods. (Mrs. S. S. E.)
Answer—No. It lacks two amino-acids and contains considerable amounts of three others. If your husband eats cheese and eggs and drinks 1½ pints (three glasses) of milk daily he will get all the complete proteins he needs, even though he eats no meat. Nuts, plain wheat, wheat germ, soy beans, peanuts, peas and beans

are good sources of protein.
Castor Oil for Warts
With skepticism I tried your castor oil treatment for warts of long standing. In two weeks time the warts disappeared—after 15 years! (R. R. M.)
Answer—Anyway it can do no harm—put a drop of castor oil on each wart every night. No charge for the advice if you promise to let me know whether it works.
Circumcision
Why do you never say anything about the circumcision racket? Too touchy a subject for any one but a rugged individualist . . . ? (Mrs. L. J.)
Answer—I know of no such racket. Generally circumcision is necessary only to insure cleanliness and relieve or prevent obstruction to urination.
