

Guided Missile Production Should Be Shifted Inland, Air Secretary Tells Newsmen

Washington—(U.P.)—Air Secretary Harold E. Talbott said today that new aircraft and guided missile production plants must be built inland away from crowded coastal target areas.

He said the Air Force opposes further expansion of the aircraft industry on the West and East coasts.

Calling for dispersion of the growing guided missile production business, Talbott told a news conference "we have no idea of trying to reduce the activity that is there (on the West Coast) but we do not want it expanded."

"The same thing applies to the East Coast," he said. Talbott called the news conference to "make crystal clear the Air Force position" on industry dispersion after testimony he gave the House Appropriations Committee created a furor in Los Angeles. In his testimony

he called aircraft industry concentration in California "dangerous" from both a security and an economic standpoint.

The Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce immediately raised a question whether Talbott advocated reducing automobile production in Detroit or steel production in Pittsburgh. Talbott told reporters he "certainly would not put a big plant in Detroit." He said, "the aim is to

siles at the huge Fort Worth, Tex., plant where B36 Superbombers used to be built. Convair is developing the Atlas intercontinental ballistic missile.

Talbott said that Boeing, a Seattle company, now is searching in the Midwest for a plant site for missile production. Boeing is developing the Bomarc anti-aircraft guided missile.

Talbott said that if North America Aviation needed new facilities to build its Navajo intercontinental missile they should not be built on the West Coast.

"We have no idea of decreasing the amount of activity, amount of contracts and amount of employment on the West Coast," Talbott said, "but we think further expansion should be moved probably to the Midwest."

He also said it is "not wise" for any community to depend for "too big a percentage" of its livelihood on one industry such as military aircraft.

In his congressional testimony, Talbott had said that 25 per cent of Southern California depends on military aircraft pay-

rolls. He told reporters today "I think that's right but I don't know that I was right to have said it."

Talbott said that the guided missile program will be "very large" in coming years. Defense figures indicate it is the one area in which military buying is on

the increase. The Air Force will spend \$275,000,000 on missile production in fiscal 1956 starting July 1.
