## Urban Renewal Plans Practiced

Chicago — (U.P.) — Five American cities have taken action to stimulate community interest in urban renewal plans as proof that their programs are workable and thus eligible for federal financial aid.

A report by the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials shows

In San Francisco, the Citizens Participation Committee for Urban Renewal has started a program for public education to make citizens aware of the problem. The committee's 19 members were appointed by the mayor.

A subcommittee on citizen participation has been appointed to advise Milwaukee's Urban Renewal Committee. The group is composed of 10 public officials.

A 16-man commission was named by the mayor of St. Louis to determine long-range housing needs for the city.

In Syracuse, a nine-member redevelopment committee is made up of local residents who make recommendations for redevelopment and rehabilitation of areas that are below standard, and in Washington the League of Women Voters held an all-day workshop on city planning and housing.

CORN FOR TITO  
Champaign, Ill. — (U.P.) — Illinois corn soon will be growing in Yugoslavia. The Illinois Seed Producers Assn. reported it has shipped 40,000 pounds of foundation hybrid seed corn to that country. This will plant 6,000 acres to hybrid seed production in 1955 and 40,000 acres in 1956. Its potential for 1957 is 300,000 acres.

## AT LAST A FAINT YAP

For years I have been harping. What else? Harping on a number of things pertaining to health and happiness — happiness being contingent upon good health. One of these things is drinking.

I have incessantly urged parents, guardians, aunts, uncles, grandparents, big brothers or sisters, teachers, coaches, doctors, even pastors to pledge growing children under their care or influence to total abstinence.

My mother, an active member of the Canandaigua W.C.T.U., and, if I recollect, an officer or a delegate or something, pledged her four sons to total abstinence, and no conceivable temptation or circumstance could have made any of us break such a pledge. Yes, we promised not to use alcohol or tobacco before we were 21.

The temptations or circumstances growing children knew in our time were indeed diminutive compared with what growing children must cope with today. Therefore it seems to me that the temperance or total abstinence pledge is a greater boon to health and happiness than ever before.

In this, I am sorry to say, Johnny is out of step. Aside from occasional applause notes from W.C.T.U. members who offer faint praise and then chide me for my smoking, I have never heard from a parent, grandparent, guardian or anyone else who admits he or she shares my belief in the temperance pledge. Especially not from a pastor, a doctor—I tell you, oenophiles, it hurts.

But I'm not giving up. I still believe the Lord is my shepherd. Today came a postal card from a New England reader who says: "Dear Doctor:

I like your stand on alcoholism. Keep it up. Today the attitude of young people towards drinking is shocking. They think it is "real gone" to get what we used to call "soused." They actually WORK at getting used to the taste and the habit. I know. I have a teen-age granddaughter.

No doubt, some doctors, pastors teachers or guardians would write and wish me well if they were not afraid that (1) I'll reveal their identity and/or (2) their parishioners, patients, employers or business associates wouldn't like it.

I'd be the last to blame 'em for that—I learned by bitter experience how one can suffer for just telling the truth. Ours is not an

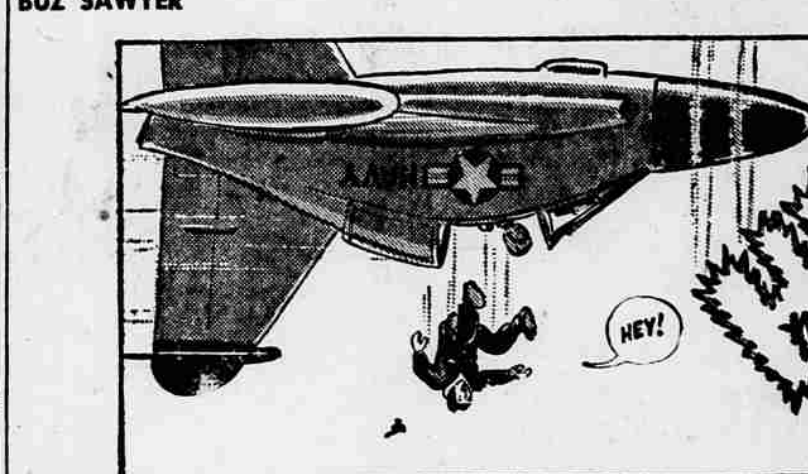
