INTERESTING BIRMINGHAM NEWS

Anti-rabies inoculation "clinics" will be held in 13 Birmingham neighborhoods, says a newspaper item (no date) from Birmingham, Ala., and the county rabies inspector—

I swan, they must have the racket working almost automatically now.

—the county rabies inspector reminds dog owners that the shots are mandatory by law. Clinics, charging \$1 per inoculation, will be open rain or shine.

Birmingham. That's the place known as the "rabies capital of North America."

I hate to bring it up again, I really do, because both Birmingham authorities who said the city was so known were, I believe sincere when they concluded their report of their long experience with the rabies problem with a statement that—

"Rabies is primarily a veterinary problem. Regardless of its prevalence among dogs, it will probably never cause sufficient morbidity or mortality among human beings in this region to allow its classification as a public health problem of importance."

Since they were this frank statement (6, 29, '39) one of the Birmingham (Jefferson County) authorities has died. The other, I believe, is still in the health department—but I don't know which.

Since the Birmingham authorities decided that rabies should be left to the veterinarians, the U. S. Public Health Service politicians moved in and those boys have a good deal to say about the contributions the federal government may make to state or county governments for public health work.

Chaplain Henry W. Anderson is a figure who will be missed for some time to come at Camp White. His last sermon was preached at the chapel last Sunday. He reports this week for his new assignment at the VA Hospital at Vancouver.

Chaplain Anderson is known to regret leaving this community. He has an attractive home in town and his wife has been teaching in the grade school at Central Point.

He accepts the transfer in line of duty both to the service and to his religious principles. His firm belief in the evangelical school will continue to carry him along the highway of life. He inculcated his second tenet firmly in the hearts of the members in his belief in Christian fellowship, and the friendly spirit pervading the camp during the six years he has been here is in large part due to his ability to practice what he preaches.

He will miss the opportunity to fish in the Rogue valley streams, but he will undoubtedly find others as well stocked over in Washington state, and in the vicinity of Portland.

Chaplain Anderson saw service in both world wars and was with the Civilian Conservation Corps in the Medford district for six years. He carries a 20 year service pin which he received two years ago. He served in this country and in New Guinea and the Philippines and was discharged at Ft. Lewis with the rank of lieutenant colonel.

The new chaplain for Protestants is the Rev. Albert S. Feller, who comes here from the Roseburg VA hospital.
