Aquatot's Father Ready for Prison

Miami — (U.P.) — Russell Tongay today gave up his legal fight to avoid serving a sentence of 10 years at hard labor for the death of his "aquatot" daughter, Kathy from a diving injury.

The Florida Supreme Court Monday night refused to grant the burley ex-Coast Guardsman a rehearing on his manslaughter conviction and his attorney, Louis Jepeway, said no further appeal was planned.

Jepeway said Tongay was "ready and available" to enter prison but some five days will probably be required for the court decision to travel through channels to local court officials, who must issue commitment orders.

Tongay was sentenced in 1951 following the death of the 5-year-old girl, co-star with her 8-year-old brother Bubba in Tongay's famous "aquatot" team.

A MILLION OR ANYWAY A THOUSAND

Seems as though there are a million letters waiting here for me to answer. Sometimes I feel guilty sneaking off to the bowling green while the pile grows higher and higher. But I tell you quite seriously, folks, that without three afternoons a week in Elysium — nine hours off, that is — I'd be so crabbed and cantankerous that I know of no other preventative so good for high blood pressure, peptic ulcer, angina pectoris, coronary thrombosis, apoplexy, et cetera, unless it be three or four miles of oxygen on the hoof six days a week.

And You, Too, Ma'am.

After a sore throat my brother's ear started running in November. He was under the doctor's care, using ear drops and penicillin. Nothing did any good until he started using the ear drops you suggest. His ear stopped running about two weeks ago. We shall be eternally grateful to you. God bless you.

Whether the ear drops I suggest had anything to do with the young man's recovery is doubtful. 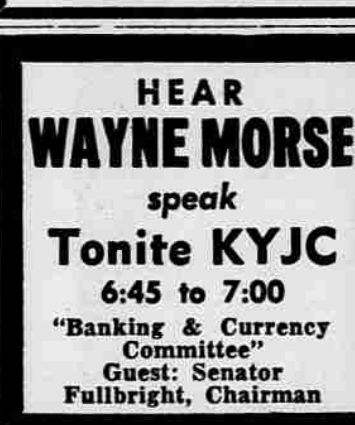

Prineville — (U.P.) — Bids have been invited at the office of the forest supervisor, Ochoco national forest, Prineville, for an estimated 20,500,000 board feet of timber on a 3410-acre tract in the Deadman, Rush, Little Hay and Marks creek drainage.

Oral auction bids will be received in the supervisor's office here starting at 2 p.m. Tuesday, May 31.

The stand contains an estimated 16,700,000 board feet of ponderosa pine and 3,800,000 feet of Douglas fir and other species.

No Inquest Planned in Ontario Death

Ontario, Ore. — (U.P.) — There will be no inquest into the death of Julian Fiarros, Mexican farm laborer who was struck and killed 6 1/2 miles south of here Saturday night by a car operated by Lawrence Price of Ontario.

Fiarros, who lived at the Nyssa labor camp, was reported walking in the traffic lane wearing dark clothing at the time of the accident. District Attorney E. Otis Smith said there was no evidence of negligence on the part of Price.

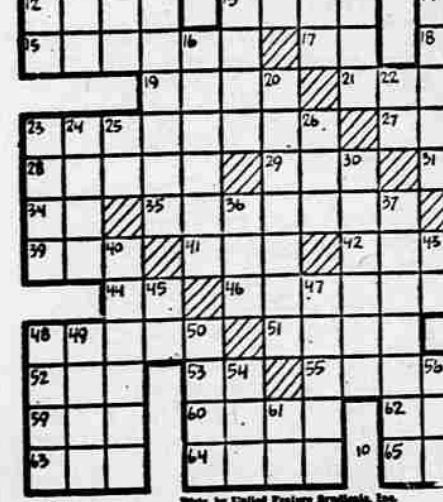

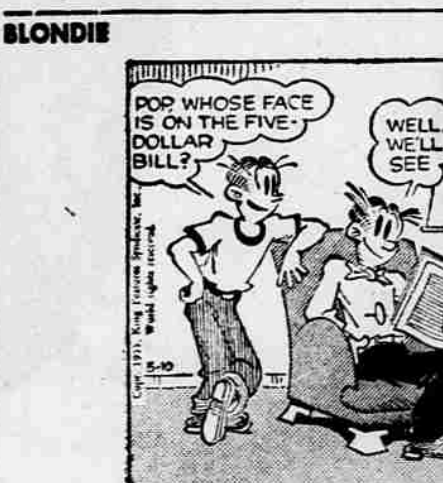

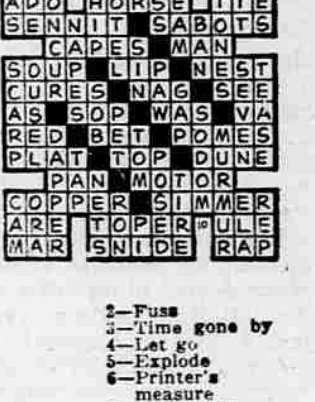
