South Viet Nam Chief Ready To Step Down

Paris—(U.P.)—Bao Dai, chief of state of South Viet Nam, told a French newspaper today he was prepared to step down and become a humble citizen if his people chose a republic to replace the monarchy.

In an interview with the influential Le Figaro, Bao Dai said: "I have always said, and I repeat now, that if the popular choice is for a republic regime, I will be happy to become a citizen."

Asked for his feelings toward Premier Ngo Dinh Diem, Bao Dai replied that it is "incorrect to analyze the present crisis as a simple question of personalities."

Identity Sought On Lehi Owners

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The Coast Guard hoped to learn today for sure just who owns the raft Lehi II.

A hearing into the raft's ill-fated voyage was to resume at 1 p.m. with Edward L. Torrey, Alameda boat builder, on the stand.

When the hearing recessed yesterday, Torrey was introducing into evidence documents which he claimed were pertinent to establishing the ownership of the Lehi II.

Torrey has claimed that he was one of the principal owners. So has Al Martin of Oakland. And Devere Baker, skipper of the expedition, says the whole thing was his idea.

The three man Coast Guard board of inquiry is trying to ascertain the facts surrounding the Lehi's voyage to Hawaii. The voyage ended as did the first, with rescue of the crew, in this case by a Coast Guard cutter.

First mate Lawrence Hall testified yesterday that Baker at first chose to stay aboard, the swamping raft when the Cutter Active arrived. However, he said when the other four crewmen got into the rescue craft, "The skipper must have realized what was happening and he jumped in with us."

Attorney Seeking Chessman Manuscript

San Rafael, Calif. — (U.P.) — Attorney Melvin Belli has filed a complaint in Marin County Superior Court in behalf of Rosalie W. Asher in her attempt to gain possession of convict - author Caryl Chessman's latest manuscript.

The manuscript, "Trial By Ordeal," was impounded by Warden Harley O. Teets of San Quentin Prison when Chessman tried to convey publishing rights to Miss Asher, his attorney, last March.

Belli asked the court to define

the state's and Chessman's rights in regard to a condemned man's property and to order the manuscript into the custody of a court clerk while deciding the issue.

Chessman is the author of the

best selling autobiography, "Cell 2455, Death Row." He has been condemned to death for a series of kidnappings and rapes in Los Angeles in 1948.
