

# Book Belonging To Missing Berkeley Youngster Located

Pinole, Calif. — (U.P.) — The finding of a schoolbook belonging to Stephanie Bryan — the first real clue to her disappearance — spurred the police and sheriff's deputies to new efforts today in their search for the missing girl.

The schoolbook, issued to Stephanie in her French class at the Willard Junior High school, was found in a field off the Franklin Canyon road, about three miles from its junction with Highway 40 near Pinole.

**Found Near Fence**

David Tyree, 67, of San Pablo, accidentally saw it lying near a barbed wire fence on the south side of the highway last Thursday. He picked it up, but thought no more of the book until yesterday when he read of Sunday's unsuccessful mass search for the girl.

Stephanie disappeared on April 28 while walking from school to her Berkeley home. Her parents believed she was kidnapped.

On the following day, eight witnesses said they saw a girl answering Stephanie's description struggling with a man driver in an auto on Tunnel Road near Orinda.

After reading of the case in the newspapers, Tyree thumbed through the book and found Stephanie's name in the back.

He called San Pablo police. Stephanie's teacher confirmed that the book had been issued to the girl.

**Area Searched**

Eight police cars from the Berkeley police and the Contra Costa sheriff's office sped to the scene and began an immediate search of the area by flashlight.

At 1:30 a.m., they had found nothing, and called off the search until dawn.

In Redwood City, the San Mateo County sheriff's office cleared Michael Yoscovitch, 24, of Redwood City, as suspect in the disappearance of Stephanie.

## Indian Diplomat Reaches Red China

Hong Kong — (U.P.) — Indian diplomat V. K. Krishna Menon reached Red China today on a mission that might set up talks between the United States and Communist China and bring about the release of imprisoned American airmen.

Krishna Menon flew into Hong Kong and then crossed the border of the British colony into Red China en route to Canton and Peiping.

The Indian United Nations delegate who is a roving ambassador for Prime Minister Jawaharal Nehru said he was going to Red China at the invitation of Premier-Foreign Minister Chou En-Lai. Chou invited him to make the visit to continue the discussions they started at the recent Bandung conference. Krishna Menon told reporters at Hong Kong airport.

He denied he was going to Peiping as a mediator trying to settle the Formosa dispute and refused to disclose the exact purpose of his trip.

## Exploratory Drilling Planned Near Ontario

Ontario, Ore. — (U.P.) — Drilling in Malheur county will start soon on a new exploratory well for gas and oil, Ray Ranger, Texas oil man who will do the drilling, said today.

The site of the new shaft will be 10 miles north of Vale. It will be done in cooperation with the Oroco Oil and Gas Co., which struck gas in commercial quantities in a well near New Plymouth, Idaho on April 26.

## Linda Christian Still Loves Power

London — (U.P.) — Linda Christian flew into London Monday night and said she "can't stop loving" actor Tyrone Power whom she divorced last week.

As for the \$1,000,000 divorce settlement, "it's so taxable," she shrugged.

The 29-year-old actress flies on to Spain today to talk about making a picture there. Any salary she makes will be deducted from what she gets from Power, she said, but "I didn't really want the million."

"What I want is work and expression," she added.
