Vale, Ore. — (U.P.) — Oregon state police are holding three Salt Lake City youths who allegedly burglarized the Central junior high school in Salt Lake City of \$1500 last Friday night.

The police said the suspects, one a soldier who is absent without leave, were being held on burglary warrants issued by Utah authorities.

They were taken into custody Tuesday during a routine road check near Juntura, Ore., and charged with being minors in possession of liquor.

It was during routine questioning that one of the three allegedly admitted the Salt Lake City burglary and implicated his two companions. The other two denied any knowledge of the burglary.

ARE DOCTORS ON DUTY AT NIGHT?

Save in his own house — I'm a doctor. Otherwise, I imagine, we would have made a federal case of it — called an ambulance to take me to a hospital, and all that funny business for a comparatively minor emergency that any real doctor could handle in his office or at the patient's home.

I believe the AMA — my pet aversion, some gullible customers will sniff — is chiefly to blame for the scarcity of honest general practitioners. From the time the late Pooh-Bah took over, slapping the officers of the Association around and started changing the profession into a business, general practice has been patronized by the machine men as "horse-and-buggy" medicine. This line suits the \$400 snob trade so well that the customers seem quite happy — unless or until some night they need a doctor.

A telephone call to the home of a doctor I had met (and loved) on the bowling green — Incidentally, folks, I'm not at all the convivial or gregarious but rather the cold aloof type — this I attribute to my monaural deafness which makes it difficult or impossible to understand what anybody is saying in a group of people. In all my half-dead life (since bird nest robbing days) I was never conscious of so much affection as I have for my bowling cronies. I appeal to you men, and women too, who are not already equipped with the hobby, activity, extraversion, game or sport every one needs to latch onto when without it he or she is likely to be relegated to the chimney corner.

Well, the doctor arrived within minutes, and took good care of me.

But I realize I was lucky. Had it not been for bowling (the robber, by the way, beat me in the final for the Paul Ehrlich trophy and he has never stopped crowing about it) we would have had great difficulty getting a doctor at midnight in the rain. Fishermen Protest Underseas Explosion

San Francisco — (U.P.) — West Coast commercial fishermen have protested against the proposed explosion of an atomic device in the Pacific as being destructive to the sardine and mackerel fishing industries.

George J. Christo, secretary of the San Francisco Sardine Association, took issue with the government's declaration that the device would be detonated in an area "completely clear of fishing grounds and shipping lanes."

"We feel that such an explosion will be destructive to marine life. The sardines, mackerel and other species are now spawning in the ocean and this explosion may completely destroy not only the fish but the spawn," he said.

New Hampshire Lake Geography Confusing

Holderness, N. H. — (U.P.) — Squam lake is barely seven miles long, but its knotted shoreline measures 78 miles.

The lake at last count had 70 islands. The farthest you can get from land at any spot is a half mile.

Despite its confusing geography, Squam lake is one of the best charted small bodies of water in the world. It was mapped by Bradford Washburn, director of the Museum of Science in Boston and an Alaskan explorer and cartographer. The job took two years.

Gen. Gruenther Sees Defeat for Russians

London — (U.P.) — Supreme Allied Commander Gen. Alfred M. Gruenther says flatly that Russia would be defeated in war right now because of the West's "tremendous advantage" in long range bombers.

"I feel that within the next three or four years we are going to be able to continue our advantage in this long range air capability," Gruenther said, referring to American and British bombing aircraft.

This was the first time the Allied commander has said directly that Russia would be beaten in any war starting now. Other Allied leaders have said the Soviet bloc has no answer right now for the West's long range

Peter Chermayeff told attendants at a first aid station he was zooming down the Beck Brook trail when a raccoon blocking his path forced him to ski to a stop.

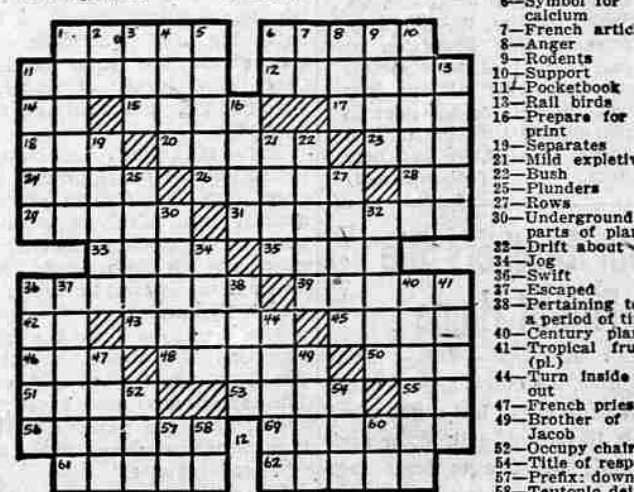
Chermayeff picked up the animal which became panicky and bit Chermayeff's finger.

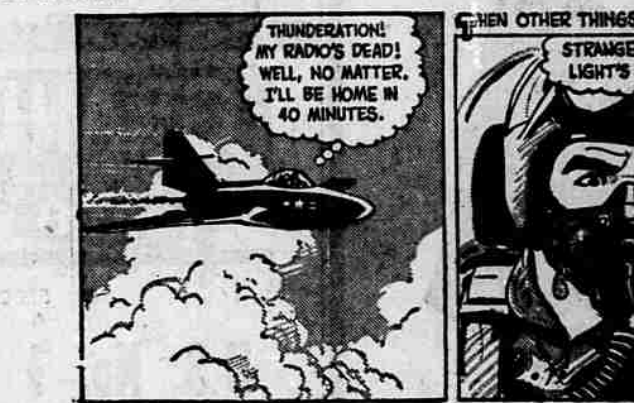

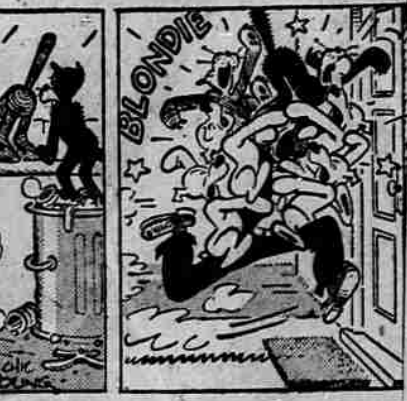
