A Nichol's Worth of . . . Comment On This and That

Washington — (UP) — Flash bulbs for cameras will be 25 years old in August. Before that day fingers were scarred, have w a s r a m p a n t, rooms were clouded with smoke, and case-hardened colleagues in the lens set wished they could work out in the open.

My first contact with the forerunner to the flashbulb was in Iowa City, Ia. I had no actual part in the taking of the picture, but I was close enough to the flash to miss a good part of a basketball game in the Iowa field house between Iowa and Wisconsin. Account of the smoke.

A bunch of powder at the time was dumped into a metal tray in front of the camera. There was a cap which set off a detonation. Smoke welled up and filled the nostrils and half of the crowd left the premises.

A friend of mine, Bob Boyd, now a respectable photographer for the Milwaukee Journal, likes to tell about the first time he had his fingers burned.

Famous Massacre

It was on Feb. 14, 1939, St. Valentine's Day. The day of the big shoot down of the George Moran-Dean O'Banion gang in Chicago.

My old friend, Bob, was going to school at Northwestern and was hanging around the city room in the Chicago Tribune Building.

There came a flash over the ticker. There was a bunch of people killed at 2122 North Clark st.

Bob Boyd was asked to go along for the ride. He went.

The killing of seven was the infamous St. Valentine's Day massacre of one gang by another.

Bob was commissioned, for the price of a steak (\$1 in those days) to handle the powder gun for a photographer.

The first shot filled the small garage on Chicago's near-north side. Bob reloaded. Forgetting his own safety, he cut loose again when the smoke cleared.

New Gadgets

Bob Boyd and the professional photographers of the time have come a long way since then.

Today, there is no muss or fuss or going off of powder in one's eyes.

The inventor of the photoflash lamp was one Johannes Ostermeier of Germany, General Electric bought the American patent rights for this new gimmick.

As of now, a cameraman doesn't have to bend his shoulder under a lot of heavy equipment, although that once was

the badge and pride of the profession.

Modern equipment is a might lighter and, according to our United Press photographers, much easier on the feet.

Examinations Set By Rep. Ellsworth For U.S. Academies

Washington, D.C. — Congressman Harris Ellsworth has announced that competitive examinations will be held Monday, July 11, for appointments to vacancies at the U.S. Naval academy, U.S. Military academy and the U.S. Air Force academy. The examinations will be conducted by the U.S. Civil Service Commission at post office buildings in Albany, Coos Bay, Eugene, Gold Beach, Grants Pass, Medford, Reedsport and Roseburg.

Candidates for the Academies must never have been married and must be bona fide residents of the fourth congressional district. As of the date of entrance into the academies, July 1, 1956, appointees must be between 17 and 22 years of age. Candidates now in the armed services are also eligible to compete.

Grades Are Basic

The civil service examination will be limited to vocabulary, reading, spatial relations and algebra. Nominations of principals and alternates to the academies will be on the basis of grades earned in the competitive examination.

Candidates desiring to compete for vacancies at the academies should notify Congressman Ellsworth at the House Office Building, Washington, D.C., not later than June 1, indicating their choice of place of examination, legal residence and date of birth.

Conservatives Gain In British Campaign

London — (UP) — The Conservative party of Prime Minister Anthony Eden is steadily gaining strength in the campaign race for victory over Clement Attlee's Laborites in the May 26 general elections, public opinion polls indicate today.

Bookmakers — betting is legal in Britain — are now quoting odds of 7-2 against the Laborites. Last week they offered only 5-2.

The latest newspaper polls also showed an increase in Conservative popularity. The polls reported that 49 1/2 per cent of voters questioned intend to vote Conservative while 47 per cent favor Labor. A week ago it was 48 1/2 per cent Conservative and 47 1/4 per cent Labor.
