WHAT! NO MAD DOG SCARE THIS SPRING?

Something I said here about the mad dog scares made a health commissioner in one city so mad, not to say rabid, that he jumped into print to deplore my dangerous teachings. I respect the man who has the courage of his convictions. The health commissioner not only had such courage, he submitted hospital reports of fifteen cases of what was diagnosed as rabies, and he even invited me to visit the health department laboratories where he showed me a rabbit with rabies. He explained that the rabbit had been inoculated with rabies virus and would die of rabies (I forget just how many) days.

The good man seemed disappointed when I said, in other words, "So, what?" But we parted amicably enough and he even gave me some information about new developments in other fields which I used in this column.

I know nothing about the commissioner's background or whether political preference or training in the administration of public health brought about

his appointment, but I regret the quackishness that characterized the protest he published about my teachings.

"The only known way to destroy rabies virus," declared the commissioner, "is cauterization of the wound with fuming nitric acid."

A quack is one who professes knowledge in a matter of which he knows little or nothing. The question of the occurrence of rabies in man, and the diagnosis of rabies in man, and the identification of rabies virus in any circumstance is a matter of opinion and not a scientific fact.

Neither the commissioner's arbitrary statement nor the most



Auto-Pedestrian Accidents Increase

Auto-pedestrian accidents are on the increase in Medford, Police Chief Charles Champlin said yesterday.

He appealed for greater care, both from persons on foot and those driving, in keeping the total down.

In the first 4½ months of 1955 alone there have been 11 such accidents, two of them resulting in deaths, compared to only 7 (with no fatalities) during the same period a year ago.

During the whole of 1954 there were only 16 such accidents, he pointed out, or only slightly more than the total for January to May of this year.

The number of citations of drivers for failure to yield the right of way to pedestrians is about the same, 23 so far this year, 21 last year.

But arrests are not the full answer to the problem, the chief stated. A consciousness of the danger of such accidents is necessary to prevent them, he declared.

There are two basic situations in most auto-pedestrian accidents, Champlin said. One is when a pedestrian is in a crosswalk (and thus has the right of way) and the driver fails to yield for him. Another is when a pedestrian is jaywalking—crossing a street away from a crosswalk, thus losing his right of way.

Of the two fatalities in Medford so far this year, one has been of each type, Champlin pointed out.

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vehement utterance of any other health official or authority can keep people frightened today as easily as "hyrophobia" frightened the ignorant, superstitious people in times past.

Let some knucklehead say how I know, let me repeat that I don't know, I just believe with all my soul that rabies in man, if it occurs at all, is so rare that no one in his senses should worry about it in any circumstance.

On the other hand, no medical or health authority will or can deny that injection of so-called anti-rabies virus (Pasteur treatment) is fatal in some instances and causes grave paralysis in other instances. Heaven only knows what is injected when so-

called anti-rabies virus is injected. I'd have none of it myself, if all the perfectly harmless, playful, irritated, mad, stray, possibly rabid or "positive" (laboratory diagnosed) dogs in town ganged up and worked me over.

For my peace of mind, and I hope for yours, I go along with Drs. Denison and Dowling of the Birmingham (Jefferson County), Alabama, health department, who, after many years of experience in "the rabies capital of North America," concluded (JAMA 7-29-39) that:

"Rabies is primarily a veterinary problem. Regardless of its prevalence among dogs, it will probably never cause sufficient morbidity or mortality among

human beings in this region to allow its classification as a public health problem of importance."
