## Record Sum Paid in Jobless Benefits

Chicago — (U.P.) — A record of \$2,000,000.00 was paid in unemployment benefits in 1954, according to the Commerce Clearing House, national reporting authority on tax and business law.

Since 1949, the report said, the average weekly benefit paid to jobless workers has increased from \$20.50 to the 1954 peak of \$25.

The number of workers covered by state unemployment insurance laws has grown in this period by more than 3,500,000. Already this year, 14 states have made significant changes in their unemployment compensation laws. New tax rates, expanded coverage and higher benefits were among the revisions enacted.

Unemployment compensation amendments are pending in some 30 states at present. Plans

to compensate workers for sickness and disabilities not connected with employment await action in Arizona, Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Oklahoma and Utah.

By next year, 1,400,000 employees of establishments with four or more employees will come under the federal law. Currently the test for coverage is eight or more employees.

## Texas Oil Reserve Figured by Survey

Austin, Tex. — (U.P.) — Texas secondary — recovery oil reserve — at least 3,500,000,000 barrels — equals the estimated primary reserve of the entire United States 25 years ago, according to a joint report by the University of Texas, Texas A&M College and the Texas Railroad commission.

A University of Texas petroleum engineer, Dr. George H. Fancher, author of the report, said the total Texas oil reserve is about 26,200,000,000 barrels. 15,700,000,000 of which are primary reserves obtained by customary methods.

Texas researchers found there are at least 2,369 oil fields in the state, with production in 187 of Texas' 254 counties. Fancher said the field-by-field and reservoir study, the first of its kind in Texas, covered 130,309 oil wells in 4,369 separate reservoirs.

A vast amount of oil exists in every part of Texas, but much of it is unrecoverable by any process short of actual mining of oil-bearing sand. However, the report said, possibilities of secondary recovery by known techniques "are so great as to stagger the imagination and to constitute a challenge to the oil industry which cannot be ignored."

## IODINE DEFICIENCY AND 'COLDS'

A reader says she and her husband have been taking the iodine ration for two years and "no colds, thanks to you. We need more doctors like you. God love you" et cetera.

Whadaya mean more doctors like me? What people really want is a doctor who tells the truth in print but not in practice. If he tells the truth in practice they change doctors.

For nearly a year I have been saving God Bless You letters in a special file, which is beginning to bulge. I had some vague idea that these testimonials—but now that I have the file ready I realize it is like money in the bank—you can't take it with you. Nevertheless, I am grateful to this correspondent and to all the others who have blessed me. No matter what the circumstances may be or how undeserving one may feel, such a blessing is always inspiring.

Whether iodine deficiency has anything to do with immunity or susceptibility to the common respiratory infections (C.R.I.) I do not know.

But in any case it can do no harm to correct iodine deficiency. I am sure, and most American adults and children get insufficient iodine to maintain good nutrition.

Bear in mind, everything I say about iodine in this column, applies to nutritional iodine. The uses of iodine or iodides as medicine is not a question of hygiene, physiology or health. It is strictly a medical question and should be left to your physician's judgment.

Perhaps the most familiar sign of iodine deficiency in children from 8 to 12 is simple goitre. In children 12 to 16, moping. In children 16 to 20, tendency to doze in church, class or other situations where they shouldn't.

Common manifestations of iodine deficiency in persons past 35: Subnormal body temperature, cold hands and feet; desire for more clothing and greater indoor warmth than normal individuals find comfortable; accumulation of excess flabby flesh; dry, scaly skin; dry, falling, prematurely graying hair; a melancholic outlook and manner noticeably unlike their former cheerful disposition.

I do not advise anyone to take, continue or discontinue taking any medicinal preparation of iodine or iodides recommended by Mrs. Sumsey or prescribed by your late Aunt Jane by a leading physician.

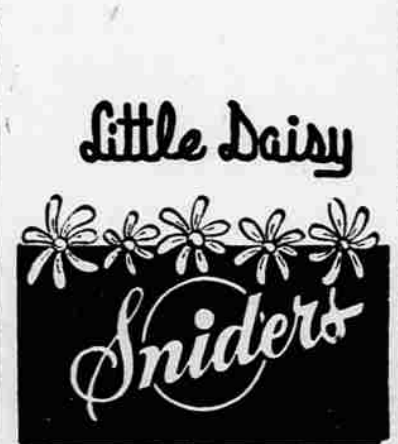

In my opinion most Americans can have better metabolism and better health if they boost their intake of iodine. And if they go about it as I say in the pamphlet, such iodine intake can do no harm.

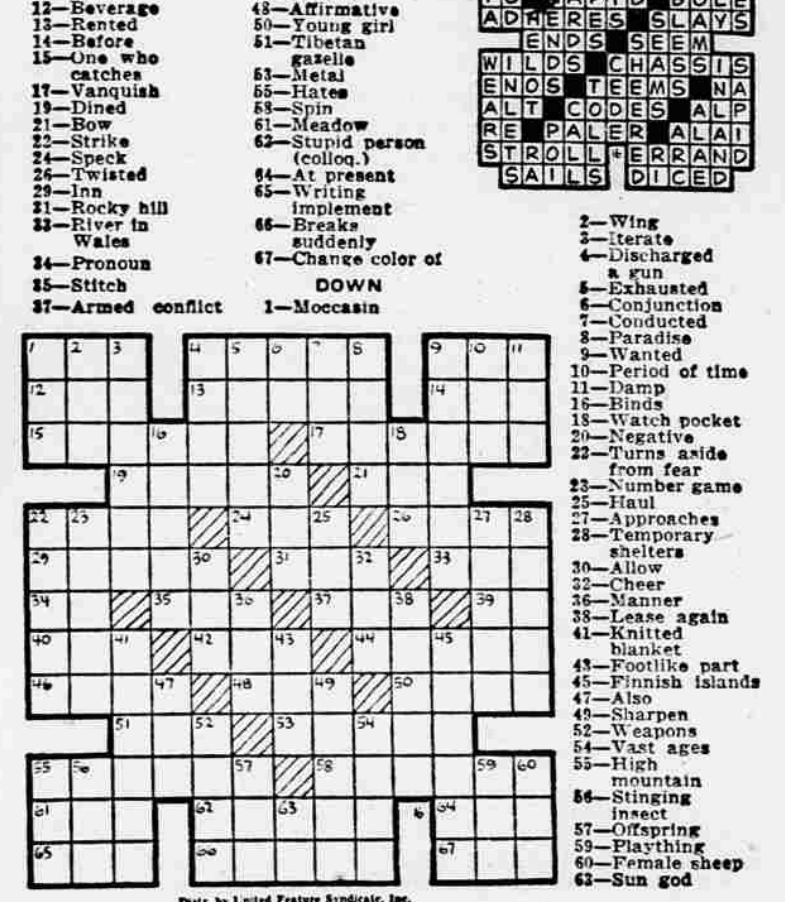

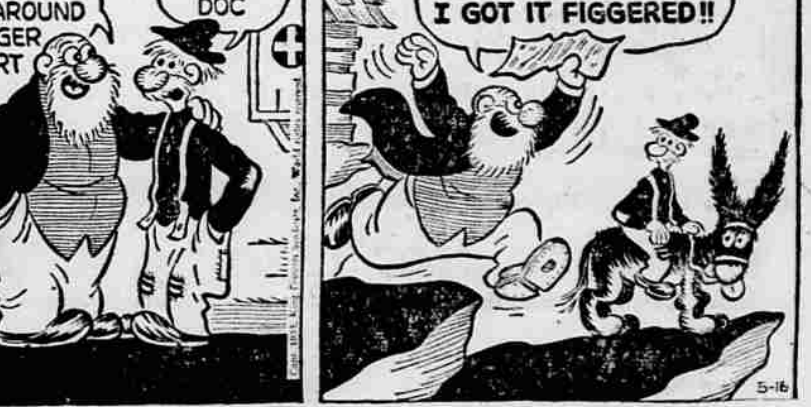

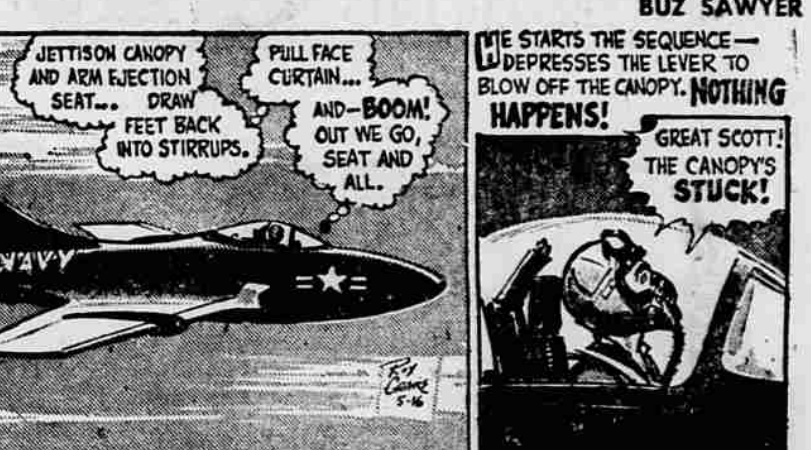
