## Many Former FBI Agents Find Success After Leaving Bureau

Washington — (U.P.)—Joseph I. O'Neill Jr., worked as a special agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation for four years. In 1946 he resigned, went to Texas and struck it rich in oil.

There is nothing in the FBI's training literature that teaches a man how to do this. But it is the kind of success story that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has learned to expect from his bureau's "alumni."

Former G-men have found that a hitch in the bureau can be a springboard to lucrative positions in business or the legal profession; to political office; or to various other responsible jobs in government and private life.

### Politics, Too

Some of the ex-FBI agents who have made a big splash in politics are Gov. Frank Clement of Tennessee, former Gov. Edwin L. Mechem of New Mexico, and Reps. Harold H. Velde (R-Ill.), Ed Edmondson (D-Okla.), Thomas Dodd (D-Conn.), and Omar Burleson (D-Tex.).

Two appointive officials of the Eisenhower administration — state Department security chief Scott McLeod and Federal Communications Commissioner Robert E. Lee — were once FBI agents. So was Vice-President Richard M. Nixon's administrative assistant, Robert L. King.

O'Neill, financially one of the most successful men in the ranks of FBI agents, now is an independent Midland, Tex., oilman worth an estimated \$20,000,000.

To Webb, another former agent who went to Texas, now occupies a top executive post with Clinton W. Murchison's \$50,000,000 Tecon Corporation, headquartered at Dallas.

Frank V. Martinek, an "old-timer" who helped break up the Angelo Genna gang in Chicago in the 1920s, left the FBI for a job with Standard Oil of Indiana and now is assistant vice-president of that corporation.

## 'Pay Off' Said Made On Army Contract

Washington — (U.P.) — Senate investigators have been told that a New York clothing firm wrote a \$1,000 check as "pay off" for government employees who helped it land contracts for 1,000,000 Army garrison caps.

Testimony to that effect was given by Melvin Carlin, certified public accountant for the clothing firm, Bonita Originals Inc. He said he was told the check was to "benefit" the government employees who assisted on the contracts. He identified the check which was made out to Leon M. Levy, one of the officers of the firm, and endorsed by him.

Carlin testified before the Senate Investigations subcommittee as it opened public hearings on charges of graft in military uniform contracts.

## Crown Zellerbach Named in Lawsuit

Milwaukee, Wis. — (U.P.) — The federal government has filed a civil anti-trust suit in federal district court against the Crown Zellerbach Corp. of San Francisco, the American Linen Supply Co. of Chicago and principal officers in the firms.

Wayne Brown of New York, assistant vice president of the California firm, and Frank G. Steiner, president, and Jonas H. Mayer, vice president, of the Chicago firm were named as defendants.

The suit charged the defendants with conspiring to restrain trade and commerce in paper towel cabinets and towels in violation of the Sherman act.

"The Department of Justice is determined to eliminate unlawful restraints imposed upon distributors of products in interstate commerce," Atty. Gen. Herbert Brownell Jr. said in a prepared news release.

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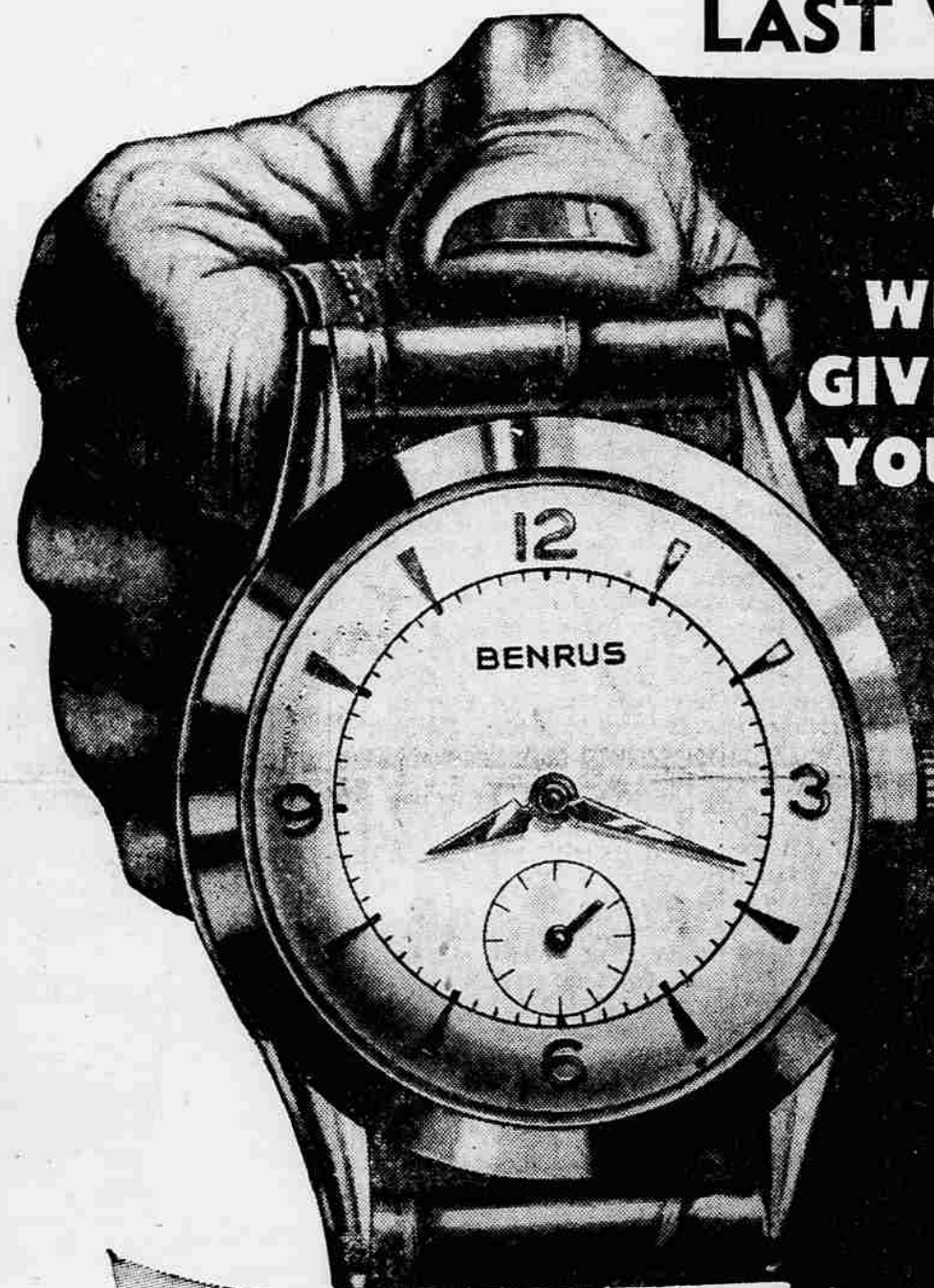
