Oklahoma City, Okla. — (U.P.) — Charles Thompson alerted highway patrolmen to search for the driver of a car he saw plunge into flood-swollen Deep Fork Creek Thursday.

An hour later, Felix Louis Klimkowski, 41, of Harrah, Okla., the driver, showed up.

Klimkowski swam from his sinking automobile unseen by Thompson and hitched a ride to town. He was unhurt.

Suspect Cleared In Lebanon Beating

Albany, Ore. — (U.P.) — Ivan Dale Hetland, 22, was cleared yesterday by a district court jury of three men and three women of a charge of assault and battery on a Lebanon man whose wife has carried on a crusade against alleged welfare fund misuse.

The jury took less than an hour to free Hetland of the March 9 attack on E. A. Gall, 65. Mrs. Gall had written a letter to a Lebanon newspaper describing what she said were misuses of welfare funds. Authorities said at the time the beating of her husband may have been a result of the letter.

Hetland testified he acted in self defense and that Gall had raised his hand to strike him.
