HUSBAND'S MARKETING MAKES BUDGET SUFFER

In some respects men are more thrifty than women, but in others they are likely to be spendthrifts.

(Q) "When I had my baby, my husband took over the marketing. Ever since then, he has insisted upon doing it. I realize that this is a great convenience to me, but at the same time the family budget is suffering. He sees all kinds of food he would like to buy, but he won't buy it. He will, for example, get fruits and vegetables out of season and he always buys the ex-

pensive cuts of meat. I know we have better food when he shops, but it means giving up some things we really need. And, with the baby, our budget can't stand any more straining. How can I tactfully take over the marketing myself?"

(A) It is a great help for you to have your husband do the marketing. Trying to shop with a baby is anything but easy. At the same time, you do not want your husband to bankrupt the family by buying food that appeals to him regardless of its cost.

A tactful way to handle this problem would be to accompany your husband on his marketing trip several times so you can point out to him what to buy and what not to buy. He may not, for example, know that some of the cheaper cuts of meat can be made into just as tasty and nutritious dishes as the more expensive cuts.

Another way to help him would be to watch for the week end specials as they are advertised in the paper. Make a list of the items that are on special sale and ask him to buy them. You can plan the week's meals around these specials.

Insist that he buy only what you put on the list and in the amounts you specify. More money is wasted on food that is not needed than on expensive foods. Many men do not know how much to buy, and as a result buy too much.

On p. 8 of the booklet inclosed I tell all I know about the basal temperature test. (The booklet is Little Lesson No. 10, Rules for Reducing, for which send 25c and self-addressed envelope.)

Barne's report made it clear enough, to me at any rate, that the test gives a real doctor as much information as the Rube Goldberg stunt (you know, the basal metabolism gadget), as perpetrated by so many, can give.

Incidentally, in a study of over 1,000 cases (Barnes, J. A. M. A., 8-1-42), the basal temperature test proved a better index for thyroid therapy than the basal metabolism test. The technique of the test is given to physicians in the medical journal

Final Arguments

In Bryson Hearing

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Final arguments were scheduled today in the loyalty oath trial of maritime labor leader Hugh Bryson.

Federal Judge William C. Mathes ordered court to session at 9:15 a.m., three-quarters of an hour earlier than usual in the hope that prosecution and defense could finish their summations by nightfall.

It was expected that the jury of seven women and five men would get the case tomorrow.

Bryson is accused of two counts of having made false statements when he filed a non-Communist affidavit under the Taft-Hartley act in April, 1951. At the time, he was president of the National Union of Marine Cooks and Stewards. The union is now non-existent.

If found guilty, he could be sentenced to serve five years in prison and ordered to pay a \$10,000 fine on each count.

Gene Symonds Buried In Lima Cemetery

Dayton, O. — (U.P.) — Gene D. Symonds, United Press correspondent, was buried beside his mother at Lima, O., today, halfway around the world from Singapore where he was beaten to death by a Communist-inspired mob while covering a bus strike.

Funeral services were held at Grace Methodist church here and burial was in Woodlawn cemetery at Lima.

A veteran of World War II, the 28-year-old United Press manager for Southeast Asia received military honors from the

American Legion at the graveside.

Editorials from many newspapers, cablegrams and letters of tribute were quoted by the Rev. E. J. A. St. Louis at services here, along with the familiar Bible passages, "The Lord is my shepherd," and "Let not your heart be troubled."

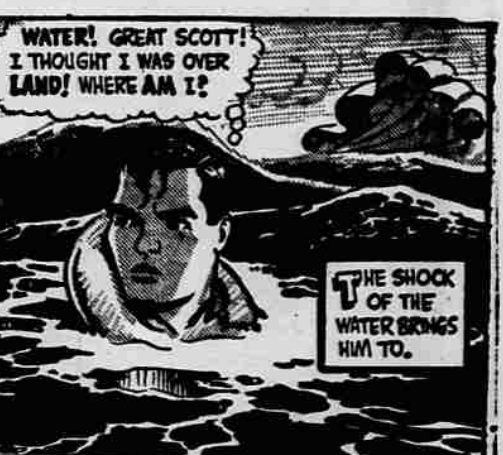
