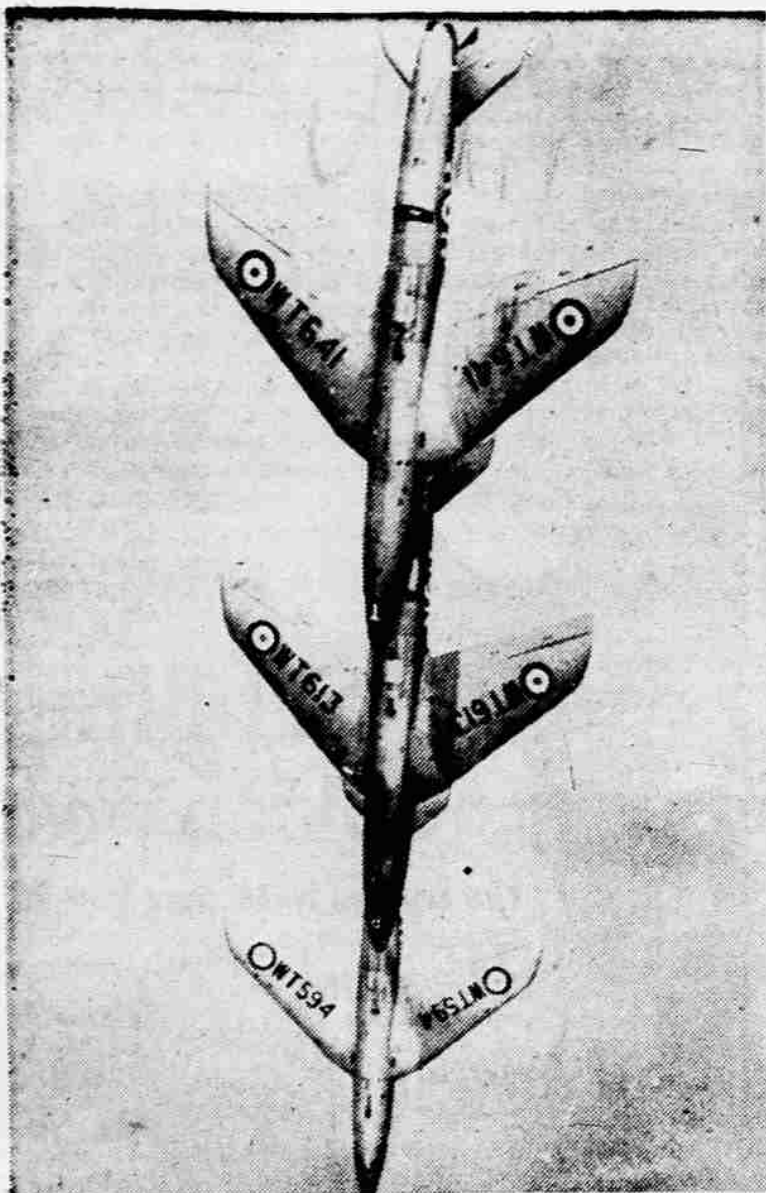

Hearing Postponed For Marjorie Smith

Portland—(U.P.)—A hearing on a request to set aside an indictment charging Mrs. Marjorie Smith in the bomb slaying of her husband has been postponed until Saturday.

The hearing was reset by Circuit Judge James W. Crawford at request of Bruce Spaulding, one of Mrs. Smith's attorneys, who will be out of town on other legal business until then.

Mrs. Smith and Victor Lawrence Wolf were indicted for the slaying of Oliver Kermit Smith, who was blown up in his car.

Republican Conference In Portland Nov. 4-6

Portland—(U.P.)—The Republican western states conference will be held here Nov. 4-6, it has been announced by Harlan Peyton, Spokane, Wash., national committeeman from Washington and chairman of the conference.

Peyton said invitations would go out to GOP governors, senators and congressmen in the 11 western states as well as other public officials in the party.

Leonard M. Hall, Republican national chairman, was slated to attend and Peyton said he planned to ask President Eisenhower to join in the regional meeting.

Low Bidders Listed For Highway Projects

Portland—(U.P.)—Columbian Empire Constructors, Inc., and P. S. Lord Mechanical Contractors, Portland, were joint low bidders, offering \$91,258 on three associated Jackson county jobs, the state highway commission said yesterday. Work is on two bridges and a culvert.

M. C. Lininger and Sons, Medford, was low bidder at \$39,040 on a rushed stone job in the Greensprings area in Klamath county, and F. L. Sommers, Medford, bid \$102,705, the low offer, for improvement of some 13 miles of the Fremont highway in Lake county.

Mexico Said Allowing Smuggling of Fish

Mexico City—(U.P.)—Mexico City newspapers charged today Mexican officials are allowing "huge amounts" of contraband seafood to be flown from Baja California to U.S. markets.

The newspaper Novedades said a fleet of 20 planes with U.S. registration were operating principally from Puerto Nueva, 25 miles south of Tijuana.

"Hundreds of thousands of pounds" of lobster and abalone have been flown unmolested to California markets without permits or paying duties, Novedades charged.

Novedades asked the federal government to step in and put a stop to the fish smuggling.

OSC To Confer 1,040 Degrees on Graduates

Corvallis—(U.P.)—Oregon State college will confer degrees on 1040 graduates at its 86th annual commencement exercises June 6. The total will include 52 doctorates, 214 master's degrees and about 744 bachelor's degrees.

The number of master's degrees is a new record for the school.

Mrs. O'Malley shrugged and smiled, "I always hope so."
