

Grandview Water Plan Contract Let

A contract for construction of a water distribution system for the Grandview Water district last night was awarded to DenHerder's Plumbing, Heating and Construction Co., Lebanon, on a low bid of \$93,691.20, it was reported by A. D. Harvey, engineer for the district, this morning.

The bid included the estimated cost of individual service connections, which are to be paid for by the water users. The main portion of the construction work will be paid for through funds raised by the sale of \$85,000 worth of bonds recently approved by voters of the district.

Five other bids were submitted last night.

DenHerder estimated the job could be completed in 100 days from the day work starts, and he plans to begin construction as soon as pipe is available. This may be delayed due to the current trucking strike.

Sugar Act Hearings Scheduled June 22-25

Washington—(U.P.)—Chairman Harold D. Cooley (D-N.C.) announced yesterday the House Agriculture committee will hold hearings June 22-25 on legislation to revamp the sugar act.

Congressmen from the sugar growing areas have been pressuring for congressional action this year to revamp the law to give them a bigger share of the domestic market.

Italy's Experimental Chain Of Hotels Held Successful

Rome — (U.P.)—Italy's experimental chain of 37 new Jolly Hotels in out-of-the-way places proved a big success in 1954, and officials say the total will be brought up to 43 by the end of this year.

A project of Count Caetano Marzotto, the "enlightened" Vicenza textile magnate, the hotels are one-third financed by the government in its attempt at economic reform for the backward areas of the peninsula.

The hotels are mostly located in beautiful but undeveloped places. They vary in size, but offer first class facilities in towns where—as a rule—no tourist facilities ever existed.

Spokesman for the Jolly Hotels in Rome is a prominent Catholic layman, Giovanni Vaccari, a Knight of Malta. He is vice-president of the hotel corporation as well as a member of Marzotto's textile organization.

"Although our hotels are designed to meet the budgets of average tourists," Vaccari said, "we have already attracted a number of celebrities. At our 58-room hotel in Trani, on the south Adriatic, we hosted U. S. Ambassador Clare Boothe Luce and a party of 10 people. The same hotel also accommodated the King and Queen of Greece."

Boost To Tourism
Vaccari explained that in southern Italy, the crisis area where the government is busily working on reform and economic improvement, the Cassa del Mezzogiorno (government agency for the region) provides financial backing for the venture. In other parts of Italy, the national tourist agency provides needed backing.

"Imagine what this means in the sense of tourism," Vaccari said. "Up till now, almost all Italian tourist trade was limited to the major cities like Naples, Rome, Florence and Venice. You could read all about the beautiful Greek temple at Agrigento but there wasn't a decent place to stay nearby, and no places along the highway between Naples and your destination. Now, tourists can travel down Italy to the farthest point of Sicily and find good places to stay all along the way."

The first Jolly hotels opened last May, all designed by the same architect along functional lines, but varying in size from 22 rooms to a projected 152-room hotel now under construction at Palermo, Sicily.

Each Jolly Hotel has an "American bar" and a tiled swimming pool, colorful modern dining room and lounges, convenient bedrooms and ample garage facilities.

New Construction
Called "Auto-Stelli" (auto stars) by the Touring Club d'Italia, the new hotels are placed away from the main highways. In Salerno, for example, the Jolly Hotel sits comfortably on the northern tip of Salerno's historic crescent beach.

Priced in the first-class range a room costs anywhere from 550 lire for a single room without bath at Trani to 4,000 lire for a double room with bath at Trieste.

In each Jolly Hotel, two-thirds of the rooms have baths, showers, warm water, and telephone. One-third have only lavatories, with other hygienic facilities shared on a central corridor.

Now under construction are hotels at Palermo, Ascoli-Piceno, Barletta, Olbia, Ragusa and Trapani.

Already in operation are hotels at Mantova, Parma, Ravenna, Trieste, Vicenza, Pescara, S. Benedetto del Tronto, Sulmona, Teramo, Avellino, Benevento, Campobasso, Caserta, Salerno, Castrovillari, Catanzaro Cosenza, Gioia Tauro, Nicastro, Praia a Mare, Brindisi, Foggia, Gallipoli, Gioia del Colle, Lecce, Matera, Taranto, Trani, Cagliari, Iglesias, Cristiano, Agri-gento, Caltagirone, Castelvetro, Cefaly, Messina and Piazza Armerina.

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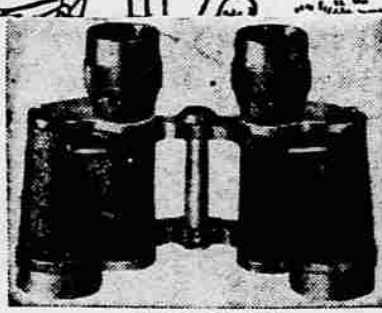
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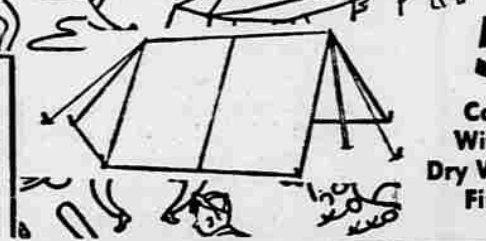
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
