

Donald Weber Winner Of New Mail Tribune Carriers' Scholarship

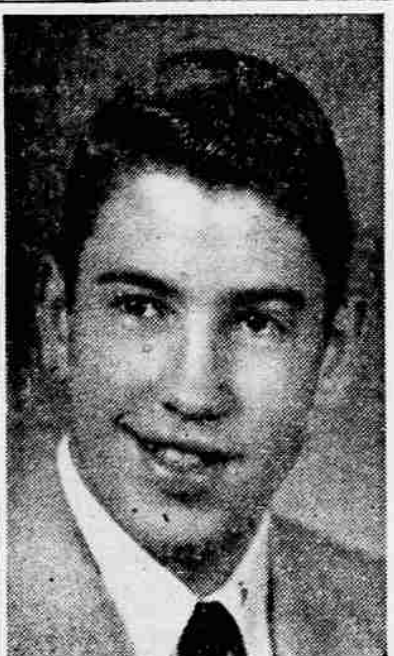

The services will be held also on Tuesday and Friday. They open at 7:30 p.m. each day.

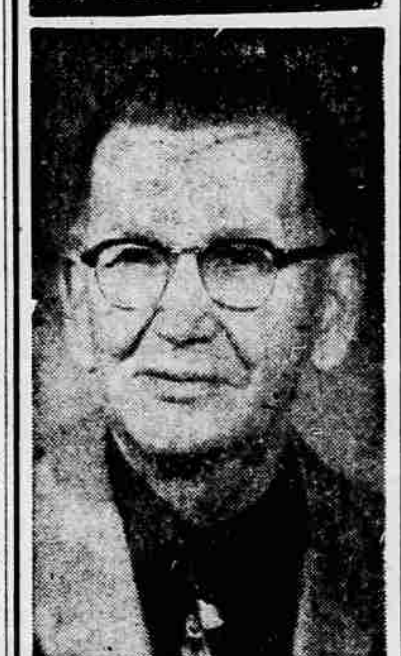
The young men are traveling ministers and have held services in Washington, Idaho, Montana and Alaska in the past year.

July 1 is Deadline For Wheat Acreage Allotment Compliance

Jackson county wheat growers have until July 1 to comply with their 1955 wheat acreage allotment, according to Albert Straus, chairman of the County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation committee.

By that time, growers must dispose of excess wheat by cutting it for hay, or plowing it under for green manure, so that it can not be harvested for grain. If this is not done, the wheat will be subject to a marketing quota penalty of \$1.13 per bushel. However, any grower may harvest up to 15 acres without penalty, regardless of his allotment.

Being Measured

Measurements of wheat acreages in Jackson county are now being conducted, and any grower who has not been contacted should notify the county ASC office in the courthouse, Straus said. Notices of measured acreages are being sent to growers, and those with excess acreage are being notified as to how they may dispose of the excess.

The restriction against participating in the agricultural conservation program for farmers harvesting in excess of their wheat allotment, even though harvested acreage was under the 15 acre limitation, recently has been lifted, Straus said.

Preliminary work in establishing allotments for 1956 is now under way. Any farmer wishing to obtain a wheat allotment for

1956 should file a written request with the county ASC office before June 30, according to Straus.

A national referendum among wheat growers on whether quotas will be in effect for the 1956 crop has been set for June 25 by the secretary of agriculture. Further details on the referendum will be announced later.
