Harrington Plays Hughes At Roseburg

George Harrington, Medford, played Bennie Hughes, Eastmoreland, Portland, this morning in the championship semi-finals of the Roseburg Invitational Golf tournament.

Don Bick, University of Oregon, and Joe Perrault, Roseburg, were the other semi-finalists.

Harrington, defending champion, downed Bob Sederstrom and 3 and Bob Tekano, University of Oregon, 1 up on Sunday to advance in the tournament.

Fast Cars Flash At Indianapolis

Indianapolis—(U.P.)—Racing's fastest cars, 33 multi-colored speedsters, flashed into action promptly at 9 a.m., PDT today in the 39th annual 500-mile dash for perhaps the richest payoff in history.

The winning crew could pocket as much as \$100,000 depending on lap and accessor awards. The leader at the end of each turn of the 200-lap grind collects \$150.

Top favorites were qualifications record holder Jack McGrath, in his eighth 500 miler; two time winner Bill Vukovich, shooting for a historic third straight title; national champion Jimmy Bryan, and Art Cross.

Pasquel Perez Keeps Flyweight Ring Crown

Tokyo—(U.P.)—Stocky Pasquel Perez of Argentina kept his world flyweight championship on a fifth-round knockout over ex-champion Yoshio Shirai of Japan in their return bout before more than 20,000 in Korakuen Stadium.

German Boxer Denies Charge by Referee

Reno—(U.P.)—Hans Friedrich, who was knocked down 14 times by heavyweight Howard King in their 10-round bout, said today he was out on his feet after a hard right floored him in the third, leaving him unable to coordinate his defenses.

The Dortmund, Germany, heavyweight denied that he "didn't want to fight." Referee Jimmy Olivias made the charge yesterday after picking Friedrich up off the mat several other times when the German had fallen of his own accord.

King, 184-pound boxer of Reno, easily won the 10-round decision as he floored Friedrich repeatedly and was striving for a knockout at the final bell.

JAPANESE VICTOR

Oakland, Calif.—(U.P.)—Katsuchi Mori, the 1954 diving champion of Japan, captured the men's Far Western Amateur Athletic Union's diving championship yesterday with an "outstanding performance" over three opponents. AAU officials praised Mori's performance in compiling 503.4 points in the event, almost 50 more than his nearest competitor, Glenn D. Rinheart.

Finsterwald Takes Open

Ft. Wayne, Ind.—(U.P.)—Golf-dom had a new name to reckon with today on the heels of Dow Finsterwald's solid victory in the \$15,000 Ft. Wayne Open golf tournament.

The 25-year-old pro from Bedford Heights, Ohio, won his first major tournament with a 19-under-par 269 over the 72-hole route. He fired a final round five-under-par 67 Sunday to shade defending champion Doug Ford of Kiamesha Lake, N.Y., by three strokes.

Ted Kroll of Utica, N.Y., took third with a 273 to earn \$1,400 and Bob Rosberg of San Francisco nailed down fourth with a 275, good for \$1,200.

Navy Cops Boat Sprint

Newport Beach, Calif.—(U.P.)—A smooth-stroking U. S. Naval Academy crew won the Western sprint championships for the second year in a row Saturday with a length victory over a surprising Stanford shell on the 2000-meter north Lido Channel course.

Navy was in command all the way. But Stanford's boat, not expected to be in contention, closed with a rush to nip the previously undefeated University of Washington shell. California was fourth.

Santee Winner In Karver Mile

Reading, Pa.—(U.P.)—Wes Santee, still striving to join the four-minute mile brigade, won the annual Karver Mile Sunday in 4:05.4. Horace Ashenfelter finished 50 yards behind the Kansan in 4:18, while Jim McLaughlin of St. Joseph's, Pa. College was third.

NATS SIGN COLLEGIAN

Columbia, Mo.—(U.P.)—The Washington Senators today signed Jerry Schoonmaker, an outfielder on the University of Missouri baseball team, to a \$30,000 bonus contract. Schoonmaker, who also played football at Missouri, will report to the Senators June 9.

'American Agents' Sentenced in Poland

London—(U.P.)—Communist Poland has announced that four Polish "American secret service agents" have been sentenced to prison for espionage.

In a broadcast heard here, the Polish news agency PAP said the four were convicted at a trial held before the military court in Szczecin.

The agency said Henry Gryszczyński was sentenced to 15 years in prison, Mieczysław Baranski to 10 years, Zygmunt Jurys to 10 years, and Robert Lukajczyk to three years.
