Prevention of the Rheumatism

Before physicians knew anything about vitamins some of them considered cod liver oil the best remedy for chronic rheumatism. Joint disability lasting a year or more was just plain rheumatism in the nineteenth century, generally ascribed to "exposure to cold and damp." In the twentieth century the diagnosis became "arthritis."

Now there's a malady a resourceful practitioner can expect endlessly. And it seems as though the customers never tire of paying for the very latest experiment that gives "promise" of curing arthritis.

I do not mean to imply that arthritis (joint inflammation) doesn't occur. Streptococci, pneumococci, tuberculosis, syphilis, and gonorrhea infection of the joint is properly called arthritis.

In most instances of real arthritis, if the trouble lasts more than a year, there is a history of acute inflammation in the beginning—heat, pain, redness, and swelling of the joint, usually associated with some elevation of body temperature (fever).

In chronic rheumatism there's no such history, as a rule. The trouble develops gradually—in any weather or climate, in any walk of life—month by month or year by year advances from bad to worse unless...

Judge Fee May Conduct Federal Court in Medford

Portland—(U.P.)—A U.S. circuit judge probably will conduct summer sessions of the federal district court in Pendleton, Medford, Klamath Falls and Eugene.

Judge James Alger Fee of the appeals court has been asked to serve this summer by Claude McCurroch, chief of the Oregon district, and has indicated he will be available.

Fee, who was boosted to the circuit court at San Francisco more than a year ago, has conducted district court business in Portland several times since.

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
