

Annual Livestock Tour of Counties Slated Next Week

The Jackson-Josephine Southern Oregon Crops and Livestock tour will be held in Josephine county June 6-7, according to Glenn Klein, county agent for 4-H work here.

On Monday, June 6, those taking the tour will meet in the city park in Grants Pass at 10 a.m. to prepare for the beef cattle judging at the Walter House farm. Following the judging will be lunch in the city park. Swine and guernsey judging will be in the afternoon at the Doerfling and Robinson farms. Dinner will be at the Q-X ranch on the Applegate river.

Tuesday Plans
On Tuesday, June 7, green chop feeding operations will be demonstrated before the tour at the Q-X ranch. At 10 a.m. sheep and crops will be shown at the Blyde Broeffle ranch. Following this will be lunch at the Q-X campsite. The last event will be the judging of Holsteins at the Martin Bros. Dairy.

Transportation for those on the tour will be furnished at an additional nominal cost. It was urged that all those without transportation meet at the county courthouse at 9 a.m. Monday. The cost of the meals for the two-day tour will be \$1.25.

Two Burmese in Jackson county and two in Josephine county under the International Farm Youth Exchange program will take part in the tour.

Vanilla, Chocolate, Strawberry Most Popular as Ice Cream Flavors Change

Battle Creek, Mich.—(U.P.)—Ice cream that tastes like peanut butter is making a hit with the moppets this summer but most soda fountain customers aren't impressed: They'll take vanilla. Or maybe chocolate or strawberry.

Flavors come and flavors go, a manufacturer of ice cream flavoring reported today, but vanilla, chocolate and strawberry go on forever, in that order, as the most popular on the list.

Especially among older people, said Jason Bloomberg, vice-president and sales manager of the R. W. Snyder Co. "Children will go for anything new and stick with it for a while. But when they grow up they seem to switch back to one of the old standbys," he said.

Since a lot of ice cream cones are consumed by the younger, more adventurous class, wholesale flavor companies like R. W. Snyder compete hotly in the field of new, unheard-of flavors. 100 Flavors in Stock

Bloomberg said his firm has more than 100 different flavors

in stock, guaranteed to tickle the most jaded palate. Some of the more exotic ones are cranberry, Dutch apple, nesselrode pudding, spiced raisin, banana puree and the popular "peanut butter swirl."

When someone gets an idea for a new flavor, a small sample is made up in the company laboratory. Then it is mixed into a batch of ice cream and all the employees line up with a dish. If they like it, it goes on the market.

New Certified Mail Service Will Start At PO on Tuesday

A new "certified mail" service will go into effect in the United States postal system on Tuesday, June 7, it was announced by postal officials here today.

The new service will supplement the present registry system. It will provide a record of delivery of first class and air mail having no intrinsic value, the same as registered mail does now, but the certified mail service will be less expensive. The rate for certified mail will be 15 cents, compared to 30 cents for registered mail, plus the regular air or surface rates.

Receipts Available
If the sender wants a return receipt for the certified mail, an additional charge of seven cents will be made.

Postal officials here said that they believe the new certified mail service will be of considerable value, and will bring about a considerable saving in postage for those businessmen who send registered letters that contain no valuables. For mail containing valuables, that should be insured, the registered mail will still be available.

Certified mail stamps will be available for the public and for collectors on June 7.
