A substantial part of the pamphlet on The Menopause, which I will send free upon written, signed request if you provide stamped, self-addressed envelope, deals with the fishwife conception of "change of life."

Other than cessation of menstruation the only manifestation an intelligent woman may associate with the menopause is, I regret to say, the discomfort commonly called "hot flashes." I regret to say so because physicians do not even know whether the hot flashes are due to too much or too little internal secretion from the ovaries—ovarian hormone; or perhaps to a disturbance of the autonomic (automatic) regulation of the circulation from some cause unrelated to sex.

Tanker-Freighter Collision Studied

San Francisco — (U.P.) — A Coast Guard investigation will open tomorrow into the collision of the Union Oil tanker L. P. St. Claire and the Luckenbach freighter Marine Snapper in the dense fog off the Golden Gate yesterday morning.

Inquiry officers will attempt to learn why two ships equipped with radar capable of "seeing" through fog should have collided. The accident occurred at 9:21 a.m. (PST), shortly after the Marine Snapper had cleared the Gate en route to Seattle. The St. Claire was inbound. There were no injuries and both vessels proceeded to port under their own power.

The St. Claire suffered a damaged bow and the Marine Snapper had a 40-foot hole ripped in her hull on the port side.

O'Connor Favors Cuffer Data Release

San Jose, Calif. — (U.P.) — Basil O'Connor, president of the National Association For Infantile Paralysis, says that information on the Cutter Laboratories Salk polio vaccine should be released by the government immediately to remove "the five o'clock shadow" over the vaccine program.

"If it hadn't been for the Cutter situation, the program would have gone ahead as scheduled," O'Connor said. "It was something we couldn't have foreseen and the Cutter question must be answered to remove any existing doubt."

O'Connor, in an address before 350 persons last night, sniped at critics of the Salk program who said vaccinations had been hastily undertaken.

"The vaccine program took many years of step by step development," he said. "Nothing has been done with anything resembling haste."
