

Back Stairs: Mamie Remembers Names

Washington — (U.P.) — Backstairs at the White House: Intimates say Mrs. Eisenhower is feeling better than she has in many months.
She has a phenomenal faculty for remembering names. At West Point earlier this week, she was able to call by their first names many Army officers and their wives whom she had not seen in a number of years.
Nothing could have been more flattering to the persons whose names were called, as it seemed, out of the blue.

Best current estimate on the first family's stay in Colorado this summer: Six weeks, beginning in late August. Last summer, the President and his wife were in Denver for eight weeks.
When Mr. Eisenhower was a West Point cadet, his room number was 2637 in the north area of the bleak, gray-walled barracks.

Maybe the President runs again in 1956, maybe he doesn't. But the politicians who are advocating his making another race can't get much comfort out of some of the remarks Mr. Eisenhower is making to friends.
To his class of 1915 at West Point, he said the other day, "My life doesn't have the freedom it once did."

A classmate stopped him Monday night in the lush estate of Gene Leone outside West Point and said, "It is sure swell to have you with us tonight."
The President said with an air of deep conviction, "And brother, it is good to get away."
And as friends at Gettysburg have heard him say lately, he refers to the White House as "the salt mine," a phrase used by his predecessor, ex-President Truman. Mr. Truman, when he didn't call the White House a salt mine, sometimes referred to the executive mansion as "that big white prison."

Someone gave the Eisenhowers five dogwood trees for their Pennsylvania farm. The trees were duly planted in a prominent spot near the house, but the Eisenhowers' farmer reported after a few days to the President that the trees were heavily clipped and transplanted to a moist area near his pond. Now the trees are doing famously.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: 1. That a special election will be held in the Medford Irrigation District, Jackson County, Oregon, on Friday, the 15th day of July, 1955, for the purpose of determining whether the Board of Directors of the District shall be authorized for and on behalf of the District to enter into a repayment contract with the United States of America, for the following general purposes:
To provide for the reconstruction, rehabilitation, repair and betterment by the United States of the facilities of the District, including but not exclusive of that portion of the District's irrigation facilities jointly owned with the Rogue River Valley Irrigation District. To obligate the District to repay to the United States, without interest, the cost of such construction, repair and betterment in an amount not exceeding One Million, Four Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand, Four Hundred Sixty-Six and 100/100 Dollars (\$1,475,466.00).
2. That for the purposes of said special election, the District has been divided into three election precincts, as follows:
Precinct No. 1, bounded as follows: That portion of the Medford Irrigation District lying East of Bear Creek and North of the North line of Sections 32, 33 and 34, Township 37 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.
Precinct No. 2, bounded as follows: That portion of the Medford Irrigation District lying West of Bear Creek and South of the corporate limits of the City of Medford, Jackson County, Oregon.
Precinct No. 3, bounded as follows: That portion of the Medford Irrigation District lying East of Bear Creek and South of the corporate limits of the City of Medford, Jackson County, Oregon, and West of the County Road known as King's Highway, being the East boundary of Donation Land Claim No. 82 and 84 in Township 37 South, Range 2 West, Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon, and that portion of the District lying East of Bear Creek and South of the North line of Sections 32, 33 and 34 in Township 37 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

4. That for the purposes of said special election, the polling places for each of the three above described election precincts has been established by the Board of Directors as follows:
Precinct No. 1—Hillcrest Orchard House, Hillcrest Orchard, Hillcrest Road, Jackson County, Oregon, being situated within the District.
Precinct No. 2—Phoenix Grade School Gymnasium, Phoenix, Jackson County, Oregon, being situated within the District.
Precinct No. 3—Oak Grove School, Jacksonville, Highway, Jackson County, Oregon, being situated within the District.
5. That the special election shall be held on the 15th day of July, 1955, and shall be held at the election shall be as follows:
Proposition:
Shall the Board of Directors of the Medford Irrigation District, Jackson County, Oregon, be authorized to negotiate and enter into a repayment contract with the United States of America, in conformity with the proposals specified in the notice of this election, under the provisions of the Federal Reclamation Laws and all acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and of the laws of the State of Oregon, authorizing the District to enter into such contracts?

6. That all persons qualified to vote at irrigation district elections under the laws of the State of Oregon shall be entitled to vote at said special election, and the election shall be held and the result thereof determined in all respects in conformity with the provisions of law governing the election of irrigation district officers.
7. That the polls shall be opened at 8 o'clock on the morning of the day of said election and shall be kept open until 5 o'clock in the afternoon when the same shall be closed. The Board of Directors of the Medford Irrigation District, Jackson County, Oregon, shall be due and payable each December 31st thereafter until the total construction charge obligation is paid in full.
To make the contract obligation the general obligation of the District, to provide for assumption

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Graham Lauded for Highly Successful Crusade in Paris

Paris — (U.P.) — A leading pro-Catholic French newspaper today paid tribute to Billy Graham for his success in one of the toughest crusades undertaken by the American evangelist.
The 37-year-old North Carolinian winds up his five-day crusade in this predominantly Roman Catholic nation tonight. Attendance has far exceeded even the most optimistic expectations.
Wednesday night, Graham attracted the biggest crowd in his Paris crusade—9,956 persons—to the Palais Des Sports. It brought to nearly 32,000 the number who have heard Graham preach, even though an interpreter must translate sermons phrase-by-phrase.
Many Answer Appeals
And the percentage of those answering his appeals to make the "decision for Christ" has been about three times greater than at Graham's highly-successful recent crusade in London.
Of Wednesday night's audience, 467 advanced to the dais where Graham stood to declare for Christ, for a four-day total of 1,872.

The pro-Catholic newspaper Le Figaro said that Graham had attracted listeners ranging from high society to factory workers. "Billy Graham's success proves one thing; the need that men have for recourse to the spiritual," the newspaper said.
Translation Nearly Perfect
Graham's aides said he believes a major part of his success in Paris comes from the fact that the running translations are so nearly perfect. Le Figaro said "one has the impression that there is an echo in the hall."
The translator, Baptist Minister Jacques Blocher, studied in Minneapolis, Minn., in the 1930s. Blocher said that Graham insisted he give not only the interpretation but also the same intonation to the words and to accompany the translations with the same gestures Graham himself was making.
