May You Return From Your Vacation in the Best of Health

May You Return from Vacation in the Best of Health (I)

Sad to say, a good many of you will not return from vacation in the best of health. In fact some of you won't arrive at the place where you plan to visit. Either you or the other fellow will drive carelessly or recklessly and, bingo! Here we go into the deep blue yonder. It takes at least one second degree sunburn (burn with blisters) to teach some vacationists discretion about exposure to direct sunlight, or indirect sunlight, reflected by water or sand to skin kept carefully in the shade.

An indoor worker who plans to take an outdoor vacation should train for it by exposing the skin to sunlight for gradually increasing periods of time twice daily, if possible, or anyway every day, beginning with five minutes and increasing the duration of the exposure five minutes a day until some tanning becomes evident; after that increase the duration of the exposure ten minutes a day.

The secret of acquiring a good tan lies in cautious graduation of exposure, which should always terminate for the day if or when the skin shows first degree burn—erythema, flushing, redness.

There is no substance which, applied to the skin, prevents sunburn and at the same time promotes tanning.

Heavy zinc oxide ointment applied to the lips, the nose or the entire face will of course protect from sunburn. So will lipstick of dark shade. Some such preparation is particularly desirable to protect the lip when sunlight is intense, for lip sunburn is painful and slow to heal.

To relieve sunburn cover with a solution of aluminum acetate, 15 grains to the pint of water. If vesicles or blisters form, the condition becomes surgical. Quit monkeying with it and procure the services of a physician and surgeon—that's singular—if he's licensed to practice medicine he is necessarily licensed to practice surgery too — understand a knucklehead? There's just one course of training, one degree, one state board of medical examiners and one license—the license authorizes the doctor to practice medicine, surgery or any specialty of either field he or she chooses.
