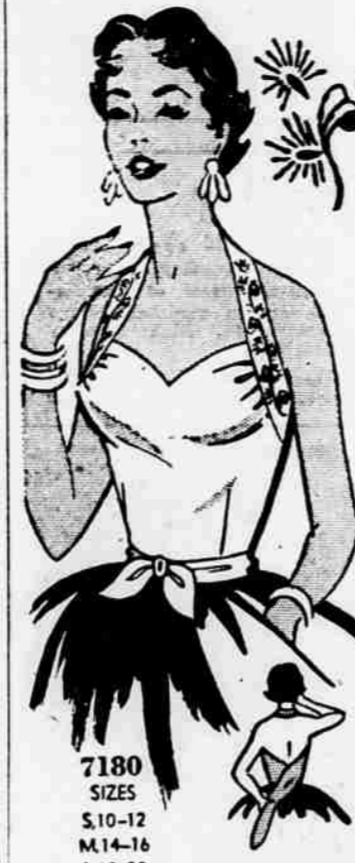

### Medford Woman Renominated to College Board

Portland—Mrs. George C. Flanagan, Medford, was recently nominated for approval by the Presbyterian Synod of Oregon for another three-year term on the board of trustees of Lewis and Clark college.

This action took place at the annual meeting of the board June 5. At this meeting President Morgan S. Odell reported that the college had balanced its operating budget for the past year ending May 31. A total of \$412,373 came to the college in gifts of money, stock and property, including a \$100,000 gift from an anonymous donor to apply on the building fund.

Dr. Odell also reported an accumulation of \$275,000 in gifts toward a new music building. The opening of Platt hall dormitory for 122 men and recognition by American Association of University Women, which granted membership to the college, were noted in the report among achievements of the past year.
