### SPURIOUS SINUSITIS

It is absurd to label ache, pain or other sensation "neuritis" if it is here today and gone tomorrow, no matter what pain-killer or sense-deadening drug or physical therapy the poor soul may be persuaded to take for the "neuritis." Oh, yes, indeed, neuritis happens, but not nearly so commonly as your trick specialist or "clinic" racketeer would have you believe.

Sinus trouble, chronic sinusitis, so-called, is genuine inflammation, infection or suppurative of one or more of the air-spaces in the skull, all of which are lined with mucous membrane continuous with the lining of the nasal passages.

In a great many instances of chronic sinus trouble the condition seems to be a manifestation of allergy, or at least allergy is the chief contributing factor.

If you are subject to chronic sinus trouble, the following report should interest you:

Dear Dr. Brady:  
For three years I have been going to doctors for sinus trouble. They gave me penicillin shots. In '52 had operation on both mastoids. . . I was going for heat treatments twice a week. . . saw your recommendation of calcium and D, began taking six a day. . . haven't been to the doctor now for over two months. . .

## Portland Company Awarded Contract For Ship Changes

Washington—(U.P.)—The Federal Maritime Board announced today that Willamette Iron and Steel Co. of Portland, Ore., will get the contract to convert two cargo ships into passenger liners for Oceanic Steamship Co. of San Francisco.

Willamette's bid for the job was slightly higher than the bid submitted by Maryland Drydock Co. of Baltimore, but a 19-year-old law gives preference to West Coast yards when the bidding is close.

The 1936 law says a Western shipbuilder's bid shall be considered to be the lowest if it is not more than six per cent higher than the lowest Atlantic Coast bid, and if the building is to be done for the shipper operating from West Coast ports.

This is the first time the six per cent factor has come into play in determining the winning bidder.

Willamette offered to do the job for a fixed price of \$26,624,000. Maryland offered to do it for a fixed price of \$25,643,825, or for an adjusted price of \$24,634,825, or for an adjusted price of \$24,634,278. The adjusted price would have been subject to

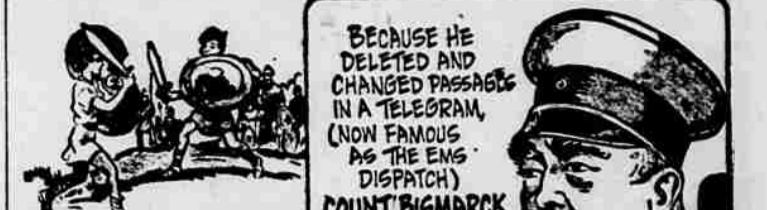
large passenger liners on the Pacific Coast since World War II.
