Wildcat Strikes Reported Settled

Detroit—(U.P.)—General Motors Corp. plants throughout the nation returned to normal production today after the last of a series of wildcat strikes against the company ended.

A company spokesman said full production would be resumed at all plants which had been closed down at various intervals because of the strikes which crippled production for nearly three weeks.

The last of the strikes, a walk-out by 2000 workers at GM's Fisher Body plant in suburban Livonia, ended yesterday when the workers voted unanimously to accept a company offer covering local working conditions.

Although the company had reached a national agreement with the CIO United Auto Workers June 13, the Livonia plant and others throughout the country staged scattered walkouts over local issues which had to be worked out between the company and local unions representing the workers.
