WHAT'LL YOU DRINK ON VACATION?

It would date me if I were to talk about the possibility of getting typhoid fever by drinking polluted well water or spring water on vacation in the country. Indeed there is little afternoons to buy feed for the doctor's horse or fuel for his furnace. Practice must be dull in the autumn. Not only are municipal water supplies kept chlorinated so that tap water is perfectly safe to drink everywhere, but a considerable portion of the population is immunized against typhoid, paratyphoid alpha and paratyphoid beta.

When it comes to the question of slaking thirst with a drink of water from an isolated spring, well, brook, pond, lake or attractive pool, play it safe: Shake up a quart of the water with four or five drops of mild tincture of iodine—the same iodine universally employed as first aid disinfectant of minor wounds—and let stand for half an hour, when it will be safe to drink.

Of course water, milk or any other liquid may be disinfected by boiling for one minute.

Although tap water everywhere is safe to drink, a person traveling, touring, visiting or spending vacation in the country should regard all milk with suspicion. Especially milk kept or served in open container such as pitcher, jar, bottle with broken seal or drinking glass. One should remember that even though the milk comes may be free from disease, the milk may be contaminated by milk, dairy worker, cook, waiter or other handler who happens to be coming down with or be a carrier of a communicable disease.

Ordinarily milk in an unopened bottle is safe to drink if it is labelled PASTEURIZED. That means the milk has been pasteurized, let say, heated up to 145 degrees F. and kept at that temperature for 30 minutes. That's pretty hot, but short of scalding. It is hot enough to kill any disease germs that might be in the milk.

Simplest way to make milk of unknown purity safe to drink is scalding—that is, heating to boiling point for a few seconds, and then allowing it to cool enough to drink.

From the standpoint of health

and nutrition I denounce every kind of pop—colored, flavored, carbonated sugar water—as beverage for growing children. But I must record here the creditable fact that pop is always safe to drink, wherever you find it, and you find it wherever you go in the five continents—you just don't go behind the iron curtain, do you?

If heat and humidity get you down or if you seek refreshment after unaccustomed physical activity and excessive sweating, it is well to remember that in such circumstances not only water but also salt must be restored to the tissues, and therefore every drink of water, fruit juice, drink, tea, or whatever beverage you take should be accompanied by a good pinch, say five grains, of salt. This will refresh you more than any amount of water or other beverage without salt.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Warts
Ten-year-old daughter has four warts on back of her hand. She is beginning to be very conscious of them. (T. DIC.)
Answer—Have you tried sticking a piece of salt pork from grandma and burying it in a graveyard at midnight? If that seems too radical, try applying castor oil to each wart every day, or painting warts and surrounding skin with weak tincture of iodine twice a week. Skilled operator can obliterate one or several warts with fulgurium (sparkling) or with electro-cauterization (surgical diathermy). Cleanest, safest way to remove a single wart is excision under local anesthesia.

Mortgage Money Program Underway

Portland — The Voluntary Home Mortgage Credit program has started full scale operations in the Pacific northwest, according to Kelvin Greenstreet, Portland, executive secretary of the government-sponsored plan.

The program's objectives are to make home mortgage money available in small communities, and remote areas, and to minority groups on the same basis that it is available in the larger metropolitan areas. "In other words," Greenstreet said, "spreading some of the mortgage money available in areas of plenty to areas of need."

Thus far the program has 105 home loans committed by mortgage lenders and 10 loans already have been closed. The loans can be either FHA-insured or VA-guaranteed. Most of them are 90 to 100 per cent loans with terms averaging 20 to 25 years at 4 1/2 per cent interest.

The regional committee and secretaries do not make the loans. Applications are sent to financing institutions that have shown their desire to help the program. Thus far insurance companies are co-operating in a nation-wide program to relieve areas without adequate loan facilities. Greenstreet said.
